HOUSER CHARGES OBSTRUCTION

Los Angeles—Dist. Atty. Houser charged Jan. 30 that Prof. Atty. Scott Rowley of Boston, Ariz., had coached Hideo Suyenaga, who assertedly allowed Yajichi Yamaguchi to use his name in purchasing a \$40,000 ranch and received as payment a red necktie and \$20.00.

Subsequently, the evicuee was ordered to jail by Judge Henry C. Kelley in Yuma, Ariz., for 30 days. Houser is seeking to return the ranch in Walter as the state through an execution petition.

On The Other Hand—

By Roy M. Takano THE DEFINITION The question of what behaviors, what activities, constitute un-American practices, has been tossed about with great flourish and is due to be mooted again with the resuscitation of the new House Committee on un-American activities.

Editor Ben Hibbs of the Saturday Evening Post's answer, for instance, indicated that he primarily was thinking about the definition in terms of spies and saboteurs. One of his criteria of un-Americanism is: "Are they agents of foreign governments or honest citizens?"

But un-Americanism obviously covers a much wider, more subtle field of activities embraced by Americanism who obviously are not "agents of foreign governments." Some West Coast farmers and merchants who profess faith in the American theory of free, competitive enterprise, for instance, oppose re-entry of evacuees to the West Coast because it would repress into the competitive fields with (against) their Caucasian neighbors.
