## OCCUPATION SURVEY STARTED IN TUCSON

Tucson, Ariz.—The Japanese Occupational Survey Committee of the Tucson Chamber of Commerce held its first meeting recently to discuss whether Japanese Americans to be released from Gila River project will be welcome to live and work in Tucson area.

L. H. Bennett, project attorney, asked that a survey of occupational possibilities be made, since the WRA wants to place about 700 evacuees in Arizona, the pre-evacuation number in that state.

## OREGON SENATE DEFEATS BILL TO ELIMINATE RACIAL DISCRIMINATION

Salem, Ore.—Oregon's proposed civil rights bill, designed to eliminate racial discrimination, was sharply defeated Feb. 7 in the senate by a vote of 24-6 after 20 minutes of debate. The measure was vigorously opposed by hotel, restaurant and apartment house owners in Portland.

San Francisco—A resolution deploring attempts to create misunderstanding and hate between American and Japanese Americans was adopted by the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People under its president, Joseph James.

In a letter accompanying the resolution, the NAACP through its president expressed "the friendly sympathy of the Branch and the Negro Community in general for the American citizens of Japanese ancestry and those among you who are non-citizens through no fault of their own."

The latter hospital's attitude, Dr. Shevin alleged, was motivated by prejudice against Mrs. Murayama, who, he pointed out, has contributed to the Red Cross and who has an uncle and cousin in the Army and a brother about to be inducted. The girl, he said, needs surgical attention.

## Most Puzzled Man in American Army Today

Minneapolis—Pvt. Karl Doi, son of Sumio Doi, whose property was the object of vigilance in Alburn, Cal., was reported in an interview at Ft. Snelling recently to be "the most bewildered soldier in the Army."

Karl was puzzled that such action should be taken against his family, who were urged by neighbors to return to their ranch. He felt that his brother, Shiguchi, who helped rescue the "lost" U. S. battalion at Bastogne, "will be puzzled even more" when he gets the news.

## WAR DEPARTMENT CITES AOYAMA

Washington, D. C.—Posthumous award of the Silver Star to Corp. Yoshiharu N. Aoyama, infantry, whose next of kin is his mother, Mrs. Tomo Aoyama of Heart Mountain, Wyo., was announced Thursday by the War Department.

His citation relates: "In 1941, on July 6, 1941, he crawled through mortar fire and small arms fire to rescue an artillery forward observer who had been wounded by enemy machine gun fire and to bring him to the medical aid station. He then carried the wounded observer to a direct hit from an enemy mortar shell and both his legs were blown off below the knee."
