### EX-TULE M. P. CHIEF HEADS P. W. CAMP

Chandler, Ariz.—In the wake of the townpeople's protest against alleged lax discipline imposed on Nazi prisoners of war at nearby Papago Park camp, an investigation of prisoners of war camps was promised this week by the Senate Military Affairs Committee and by the War Department.

It was disclosed by Army Provost Marshal General A. L. Lerch that Lt. Col. Verne Austin, who was in command of the M. P. detachment at Tule Lake, Cal., at the time of the outbreak last year, is commandant of the Papago Park camp. Japanese prisoners of war, incidentally, total 2,820.

We don't know, as yet, the complete agenda of the Salt Lake City "race delegates" conference. Among other subjects the representatives might discuss the subject of just how many issei are eligible to receive social security benefits.

### Nisei Girl Thief Wins Leniency of Judge

Chicago—Miss Sandra T. Kawakubo, 18, of 4943 Sheridan road, American born of Japanese ancestry, complained to Judge Francis Borrelli in Pelony court yesterday that she was being "persecuted" because she was a Japanese. She had been arraigned on a charge of stealing \$500 from Mr. and Mrs. Benjamin Spiegel of the same address.

Miss Kawakubo said she took the money because she needed it for doctor bills and baby clothes. The father of her expected baby, she said, is an American sailor who lives in Hawaii and had paid back \$300, and that people picked on her because of her ancestry.

"To prove we don't do that in this country," Judge Borrelli said, "I'm going to put you on probation for one year provided you return the rest of the money."

Chicago—Charles J. Oda, 30, of 607 Oakdale avenue, an American-born Japanese, was recovering in Illinois Masonic Hospital today. His life saved by blood plasma from the American Legion blood bank.

Oda, who neighbors said served in the U. S. Army from September, 1941, to November, 1943, slashed his arm three times with a razor last night after writing a note saying: "I am a good loyal American. I want to go, I am no spy or the things they say. Please believe me. There will never be peace anywhere for me."
