THE "LEVELS"
To apply the word popularized by government agencies, the racial question is being handled sympathetically in the administrative and, to an encouraging extent, political "levels." The issue is not being handled with extensive sympathy in the social and economic levels.
To illustrate: In Denver the so-called race riots are reaching a proportion which is demanding an immediate civic action. The skirmishes usually involve Caucasians and Mexicans. The out-numbered nisei here reportedly ran a hurried third in these fray-tens two. From Mexico City comes the story that a resolution against racial discrimination was introduced at the Inter-American Organization Committee.

Item three: At the coming San Francisco United Nation's assembly, China is expected to request that the principle of race equality be included in the post-war international compact. Japan demanded race equality in the League of Nation's Covenant 25 years ago. It was rejected. Unlike Mark Twain's complaint about the weather regarding which he said, "No one did anything about it except to get it out here and abroad press for something definite to be done about the universal racial question."

MISSISSIPPI FARM RESETTLEMENT HIT

New Orleans, La.—St. Charles and Jefferson parishes, along the Mississippi river, last week protested a reported proposal for establishment of a Japanese farming and fishing colony.
Meanwhile, Rep. Paul Maloney, La. notified Secretary of Interior Ickard and Secretary of Agriculture Wickard that his congressional district opposes establishment of Japanese colony there as harmful to the economy of the area. Maloney said there is an over-production of vegetables there at present and he wants available land for returning soldiers, according to the New Orleans Times-Picayune.

San Francisco, Calif.—A Japanese American family of nine was attacked with fire and bullets early on the morning of March 10 by a group of unidentified men who applied the torch to the ranch home on the San Jose Alviso road near San Jose to which they had fled from the State of Utah, the San Francisco Chronicle reported.
Victims of the attack were Suyeiki Takeda, 60; his wife, Misao, 51; their son, Joe Takeda, 25; Joe's brothers and sister, Bill, 20; Herbert, 16; Edward, 14; and Beverly, 12; a brother-in-law, Philip Matsumura, and Philip's wife, Sue.
Evacuees of Japanese ancestry, it was reported on March 2.

NISEI GIRLS LIKED IN SERVICE OFFICE

Wash., D. C.—Community War Fund solved its clerical problem by hiring 16 Japanese Americans—among the best employees the fund has had—through WRA. It is described in an article entitled "Need More Help?" in a recent issue of "Community," the national bulletin of Community Chests and Councils, Inc.
"Before hiring the girls a poll of the Washington Fund's personnel was taken and it was found all workers welcomed them. They are excellent clerks and typists, they adapt themselves rapidly and they soon win their way into the hearts of the other girls with whom they work," says Mr. Willett.

"Have the girls met antagonism in D.C.?" None whatever, and they're surprised, they'll tell you. They had expected a lot of it."

\$4000 Fire Destroys Former Japanese Hall

BOSTON UNCERTAIN ABOUT PERMANENCY

The newspaper Boston Traveler, Mass., in its editorial last week said that while evacuees probably can fit into New England industry and agriculture within the year, it is hard to see how the East Coast could eventually the same kind of feeling against them as the West Coast shows, for the same economic reasons.
The editorial suggested that it might be wiser to wait and see if "suitable inland homes for them under the American flag may not develop out of the Pacific war."
