SAN JOSE HOSTEL PREPARE TO OPEN

San Jose, Cal.—Preliminary plans to open the old Japanese school building, 630 N. Fifth St., as a temporary hostel for Japanese American citizens returning to this area were made at a conference called yesterday by the San Jose Council for Civic Unity in the Student Union, San Jose State College. The meeting, attended by about 30 interested citizens, was addressed by James E. Edmiston, director of the new War Relocation Authority office, opened Feb. 23, at 515 S. First St., and by Miss Celso Leblond, acting national secretary and director of the San Francisco office of the JACL.

Ickes Explains Policy

Washington—Japanese American, says Interior Secretary Ickes, will be better off if they settle elsewhere than the sections of the Pacific Coast where they might meet opposition. Ickes wrote Sen. Cordell (R., Ore.), that "our policy from the beginning has been to discourage the return of the Japanese to the Pacific Coast."

EXPATRIATION LIST GROWING

Washington, D. C.—A Japanese American expatriation list is growing which stood at 6000 on Jan. 16 as reported by Atty. Gen. Francis Biddle, now stands at 7000, according to his letter to Rep. Claire Engle, Cal. The story, reported by Hearst syndicate's Ray Richards, asserted that West Coast congressmen greeted this report with enthusiasm, declaring that the three West Coast states are gradually winning the war to deport acknowledged Japanese disloyals. General deportation of Japanese American expatriates and majority of the aliens would leave perhaps as few as 50,000 Japanese in the country, Richards predicted.

Arrest 2 On Charge Of Misrepresentation

Salt Lake City—Federal officials Friday charged upon two Japanese, who allegedly had misrepresented their identities to illegally recover three guns, U. S. Attorney Dan B. Shields said Friday. The two, Minoru Onda and Shiro Yokoyama, were arrested by U. S. Deputy Marshals John Babcock and George Walker less than 10 minutes after they had obtained possession of a 16-gauge shotgun and two .22-caliber rifles, he said.

REPORT GOVERNMENT HAS TURNED DOWN SUGGESTIONS MADE BY W.R.A. EVACUEES

Denver—After three years, W. R. A. centers are kept operating until the war is over and the plea from them for greater government relocation assistance and subsistence allowance while remaining in camps—all of these requests have been rejected by Federal authorities. So stated a dispatch from Washington, D. C., carried Mar. 20 in the Los Angeles Times. There was no reference to the requests, substantially equivalent of the above requests, made at the recent Salt Lake City evacuee conference.

Recover \$12,000 Buried On Pearl Harbor Night

Denver—After three years, Ernest Takaki, 35, former engineer, is in possession of \$12,000 he buried in the floor of his apartment on the night of the attack on Pearl Harbor. Takaki, now in the U. S. Army, was in the company with Chief of Police Delano Anderson when he discovered the money, which had been hidden beneath a slab of concrete. Then he placed it in a bank. Takaki is on furlough from a Massachusetts Army post. His wife and child are in a relocation camp.

V. P. TRUMAN HITS INTOLERANCE

Chicago—Vice President Harry S. Truman today told the Irish Fellowship Club that the United States needs to drive out racial and religious intolerance. "America is more vulnerable to intolerance and bigotry because this race is made up of more differing races than any other country in the world," he said. "The doctrines of intolerance, he said, are hindering international cooperation, and he called for 'spiritual guidance of inspired leaders who lead the above creed and call to help community gain security.'"

Deportation Unlikely For Issi Indigents

The Naturalization and Immigration Service has advised the W. R. A. that there is no danger that Japanese aliens will be deported to this country because of acceptance of public assistance of any type. It was learned recently that a number of that aliens who were kept in this country more than five years cannot be deported for that reason. Moreover, even if an alien has accepted public assistance within five years after coming to this country, he cannot be deported unless it is shown that the cause or reason for need for public assistance existed before he came here.

Resettlement Urged By Utah's Jurist

Utah—Justice James H. Topaz of the state supreme court, speaking at the induction of newly elected Topaz council recently, praised the conduct of the people of Japanese ancestry residing in this W. R. A. "relocation center" and urged them to return to normal lives in outside communities now that the exclusion order has been lifted.

INTRODUCE BILL ON SEGREGATION

Washington—Rep. Adam Clayton Powell (D., N. Y.) today introduced a bill to forbid racial segregation in the armed forces after the war. Nisei and Negro soldiers in this war, are fighting in their own units.
