### SEE CONCLAVE AS FOCUS FOR POLICY

A generally improved state of mind in California, no state-wide agitation in Washington despite Gov. McNamara's provocative statements regarding the returnees, and a generally apathetic attitude in Oregon toward preventing anti-evacuee actions—these are the observations of Carey McWilliams on the West Coast attitude toward the evacuees as the United Nations Conference got underway in San Francisco.

"In terms of its effect upon the rapidly changing pattern of race relations on the West Coast," Williams observed in his article in the PM newspaper, New York, the conference is perfectly timed. For right now the West Coast is undecided as to whether it will undertake a general reversal of its traditional attitudes toward unlike racial groups, a decision that has been of urgent importance to the Army's decision lifting the ban last December against the return of Japanese Americans.

### Report Progress In Canadian Resettlement

Ottawa—Reporting here April 14 on the work of the Japanese Division of the Department of Labor, Hon. Humphrey Mitchell, minister of Labor, announced that movement of evacuees eastward from British Columbia during 1944 had been "slow but steady."

His report showed that 62 per cent remained in B. C., 29 per cent are settled on the prairies, and 18 per cent in the eastern provinces of Ontario and Quebec.

Mr. Mitchell's report also noted that of the 23,000 Japanese evacuees, 70 per cent are Canadian citizens, and 61 per cent had been born in Canada. The government has had to provide maintenance for 3,600 unemployable children, and supply school facilities for 4,000 children.

### TOKYO SHOWS AVID INTEREST IN ANTI-EVACUEE ACTIVITIES ON WEST COAST

San Francisco—The San Francisco Chronicle on April 18 predicted a rapidly approaching showdown on the question of returnees, contrasting the Sumio Dai trial, the use of incidents by Tokyo Radio on "Ku Klux Klan" tactics against Nisei on the West Coast in attempts to discredit the current San Francisco Conference and the proclaimed principles of the United Nations and Senator Shelley's introduction in the state legislature of six Nisei soldier veterans.

The United Press quoted WRA's Dillon Myer as saying: "Tokyo has been particularly active in broadcasting its views."

### THE DEGREES OF GUILT

With V-E Day nearing hourly, we are being acquainted with volumes of discussions on war guilt and the promised meeting out of justice to the enemy war criminals.

In the ultimate sense, consideration of this matter can help to crystallize in our own minds the kind of post-war universal society that we desire to build for ourselves.

### On The Other Hand—

A fanatic absorption in this apprehension, the trial and the passing of the sentences upon the guilty, however, may be apt to create in our minds a blind zeal with regards to our own guilt of omissions and commissions which contributed to this war. Just as in jurisprudence, where, in attempts are made to examine and determine the degree of guilt of a criminal, so in this subject for today, all of us might profitably weigh in our own conscience our own guilt which originated this war—and be certain not to bypass the more unpleasant aspects of this guilt.

The ultimate weight of our nation's actions, in one sense, can be no more than the ultimate total of our daily actions and reactions.

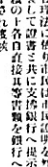

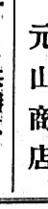
