### WHAT IS A MINORITY?

In days prior to this ominous war and even during the preceding days as far back in yesterday as in the time of Adam and Eve, two groups of people have ruled the world. Under the title of Majorities and Minorities, these groups are not engaged in a battle of sectionalism nor have they made a successful attempt of founding just such groups. But in the course of human events, it has come to be borne and perhaps shall live an eternal life.

As the definition of a majority implies; it is explicit that a minority stands less in number as well as in some privileges. But neither number nor actually has any stronghold over determining the opportune success of any individual today as belonging either to a majority or to a minority. We Nisei, like our progenitors, are placed in the category of lesser men. With some of us, the role which we have been forced to partake has made us bitter and resentful. But with others, it has brought

out a fiery determination to prove to the world that we Nisei, as a people, have within us the royal blood of Democracy. Some have proved it by blood; others proved it with success in which even a minority has the rightful power to stand against its aggressor.

Just how is a minority to be described in a few words? The chosen heroes of our earth have been in a minority. There is not a social, political, or religious privilege that you enjoy today that was not bought to you by the blood and sweat and patient sufferings of the minority. It is the minority that have vindicated humanity in its struggle. It is a minority that have stood in the van of every moral conflict, and achieved all that is noble in the history of the world.

If a man stands for the right and the truth, though every man's finger be pointed at him, though every woman's lip be curled at him in scorn, in struggle in a majority, and God and all good men are with him, and noble as they feel, are with him, but all they that are against him.


