



## The Open Forum: Action by Our Government And Attorney General Urged Against Vigilantes

Both Branches of the California ACLU Send Messages  
To Top State Officials

Dillon S. Myer, national director of the WRA, reports that there are still 53,000 evacuees in the eight Relocation Centers, with over 100,000 more who have left since their removal. He also affirms his previous declaration that "they must all be up by Jan. 2, 1946. To this end schools and other activities at the centers are being curtailed and additional measures are being taken to move out what is being brought. Recently \$175,000 in additional funds was made available to aid them in re-establishing themselves in normal communities. This money will go to 100,000 persons being helped through welfare agencies, to help them. Also government offices have been set up in Santa Barbara, Los Angeles, San Diego and El Centro to give guidance to those who return here.

A warm welcome has greeted many of the returning evacuees. Former neighbors and neighbors have been exceedingly kind to them. But, on the other hand, acts of terrorism and other sorts of opposition are being employed to keep them from returning. This is true in Fresno, Orini, Parlier and Watsonville, all California places.

When some members of a CO unit in Stockton refused to go to the centers where they had come back, union officials suspended them and now they are being placed on trial.

The attitude of public officials in the matter of enforcing the law against hoodlums is the most recent feature of the situation. General Robert W. Kroc has been urged to file felony charges against Levi Mulvaney or Parlier, who admitted he had sent four blasts from the walls of his home at Iwatsaki Iwatsaki on the night of May 22 while the latter, his wife, three children and a grandfather were inside the house. Mulvaney, on May 23, pled guilty to the charge of conspiring to commit a "deadly weapon" in a "rude, angry or threatening manner" and was given a suspended sentence by Justice of the Peace L. B. Crosby, who admitted the decision was "a community arrangement."

## Land Acquired by Aliens in Cal. Declared State Property by Court

Dumay Real Estate Deals Held Fraud in Legal Decision

LOS ANGELES. — Land acquired by alien Japanese through "dumay" sales is a "fraud on the state of California" and becomes the property of the State at the time of the sale.

So ruled Superior Judge Emery H. Wilson last Thursday in a decision hailed by Dist. Atty. Howser as "a potent weapon against an organized plot by Japanese aliens."

### Demurral Overruled

Specifically, the decision overruled a demurral by Fumiko Mitsuuchi to action brought by Atty. Gen. Kenny and Howser to escheat to the State a \$100,000 tract of celery land in the Saitewell district which the State had sold to a Japanese operator and paid off by aliens, although Mrs. Mitsuuchi took

land ownership, any aliens who are ineligible for American citizenship.

The Security-First National Bank, one of the defendants in the suit, and the land agent, Mitsuuchi, who allegedly took title for Roy Nakamura and Tomoaki Sakoda, Japanese aliens prosecuting the action are Asst. Atty. Gen. Everett W. Matson and Dep. Dist. Atty. George V. Sizemore of Los Angeles, and Adolph Alexander.

The current news brings an eloquent reminder that Japanese American boys have not confined their Americanism to mere heroes; there has been heroism as well.

American soldiers of Japanese ancestry have suffered 211 fatalities in the European war; 361 killed in action, 49 dead of wounds, 1651 wounded, 34 missing and six captured. The last battle in which they fought was at Sicily, where they were indomitable. A continental island Japanese is hard to capture, but his "decadent" Americanized cousin is as well.

It may well be that these usually figures are heavier in proportion than American losses in the same period. No doubt casualty figures, possibly suggesting blind courage, tell the whole story; as early in June of last year nine out of ten men in the Nisei 100th Infantry Battalion had reached


