



Policy Governing Center Visits Modified; Effective April 16

WASHINGTON, — A modification of the present policy governing visits to relocation centers effective April 16, allows relatives to visit two visits not to exceed an accumulative total of 30 days according to an announcement by WRA Director Dillon S. Myer.

The new regulation, found in a revision of WRA Manual Release 1501.10, also eliminates the previous requirement for advance approval for visits to the centers.

Another feature of the adjusted policy is the provision for application to the Project Director for the refund of all guest charges if a visitor has accomplished or scheduled the relocation of other family members during his stay at the center.

The altered ruling is intended to permit as free a movement as possible of center visitors consistent with the necessity for conserving the resources of the agency and of transportation facilities, during the liquidation process, in order to give maximum service to the greatest number of center residents.

An evictee may divide the allotted 30 days between his two visits in any desired manner. An emergency involving the death or serious illness of an immediate family member will permit a visitor to come to the project without having the period of the emergency charged against his visiting time.

While advance permission is no longer necessary to visit new plan, District Relocation Offices and cooperating agencies will encourage those planning visits to consult the appropriate field offices first. The prospective visitor may take advantage of local facilities as aids in his family plan.

In addition to health emergencies, others excluded from the limitations on time and number of visits are: (1) members of the Armed Forces Reserve; (2) persons conducting official business outside such as newspaper editors, fire center residents for outside employment, and (3) students who have not completed courses and who must attend classes at the center. Letters from authorized officials of college, trade or high schools vouching for their enrollment. These students will be permitted a 90-day stay, to be counted as one visit.

Visits beyond the 30-day limit may be extended by the Project Director up to 30 additional days if a relocation plan is definitely in process for the visitor's family members, and the Project Director is satisfied that the plan can be completed through an extension of time.

Applications for exceptions to the regulations should be made to the Project Director in advance through the field Relocation office. The Director must approve such exceptions except in extreme emergencies, no time will be admitted pending application for a third visit. If an evictee attempts to enter or remain at a center without

permission or obtains permission through fraud or misrepresentation, he will be required to leave immediately. Such a person will thereafter be ineligible for further relocation assistance grants and transportation of property, unless the Director, on recommendation of the Project Director, approves an exception.

Charges for meals and lodging will be made to all non-resident evictees except the following: vacationing students on 90-day visits; members of the Enlisted Reserve Corps; relocated evictees, who, after pre-induction physical examinations have not yet been inducted or placed in the ERC (these men, however, are subject to the visiting time limitations); and members of the armed services on active status, who will be charged for board and not for lodging. Guest charges are payable in advance for the estimated or authorized duration of the visit. Refunds will be made for unused payments.

Policy on reductions to centers and transfers between centers remains unchanged. No readmissions will be permitted because of ill health or inability to make an adjustment in an outside community. Instead, the Area Relocation Officer will assist in solving problems incident to relocation.

Placer's Largest Venire Summoned for Terror Case

AUBURN (Placer Co.), — Superior Judge Raymond McIntosh of Sierra County, sitting on the Placer County bench, has ordered 299 names drawn for the jury venire to appear April 17 for the trial of four men accused of acts of terrorism against Sumio Doi, Nisei rancher.

It is the largest venire ever drawn for one trial in the history of Placer County. The defendants, James E. Watson, 36, his brother, Claude P. Watson, 35, and Elmer Johnson, 20, and his brother, Alvin Johnson, 18, will be tried jointly. Claude Watson is charged only with illegal use of explosives. The others are accused of arson and illegal use of explosives.

Judge McIntosh acted for Superior Judge Lowell L. Sparks of Placer County who is ill. Sheriff Charles Silva of Placer County Thursday commencing the work of notifying the jurors to appear.

CHICAGO, — An elderly man of Japanese ancestry found dead in Chicago last week, was identified as George Kintaro Matsuura. Death was due to an accidental fall, it was stated. Mr. Matsuura was not an evictee according to information reported following an investigation.

War Department Revises Oath Required of Nisei in Filing Special Draft Questionnaire

Change Removes Implication of Previous Foreign Power; Oath Originally Used in 1941

WASHINGTON, — An oath of allegiance to the United States citizens of Japanese ancestry are required to file in a Selective Service foreign government questionnaire. The War Department indicated recently.

Under the original oath American-born citizens of Japanese ancestry were required to "forbear allegiance to the Japanese Emperor or any other foreign government." This wording has been dropped unless it is asked by the Service form and the question "Have you had in the past or do you now have any allegiance or obedience to the Japanese Emperor or any other foreign government?"

"If yes, do you hereby swear that allegiance or obedience?"

Allen of Japanese ancestry is now being accepted by the United States Army as a volunteer. They are required to take an oath forbidding allegiance to the Japanese Emperor.

Night Rides Fire Into Home Of Former War Veteran

MADERA, Calif., — FBI agents Wednesday joined the police inquiry into a garage attack on the home of a recently discharged American soldier of Japanese ancestry, Mitsuru Ohashi, in Madera on March 26.

Five shots were fired into Ohashi's house from a speeding car Monday night, but none of the Nisei in the building were injured.

Deputy Sheriff Ray M. Andrews said the bullets came from a caliber pistol.

Three of the occupants of the house at the time of the shooting have U. S. Army status. The house owner, Mitsuru Ohashi, has recently been in the Eighth Service Command, Dallas, Tex., after induction at Camp Robinson, Ark. He had been honorably discharged.

Two of the occupants of the home, both relatives visiting Ohashi, were of headquarters detachment, War Department personnel, Fort San Houston, Tex., and S. Dobashi, 29, a reservist in the Ninth Service command, Ft. Douglas, Utah.

Ohashi returned to Madera on Feb. 13 followed by his family on March 11.

Fred Kimmyuk, a neighbor, told Sheriff's officers that he heard a car pass at high speed just before the shots were fired. Ohashi none of the five bullets fired from the 12 caliber revolver plowed through a window, and passed within five inches of his head.

HONOLULU, T. H., — A resolution asking Congress to require the Navy to accept qualified citizens of Japanese ancestry for service was introduced in the Territorial Senate on March 13 by Senator Thelma M. Akana, R. Oahu.

The resolution also requests that the Army and Navy be required to accept Americans of Japanese ancestry for service in the medical and nursing corps.

The measure cites the record of citizens of Japanese ancestry in World War II and stresses that Americans of German and Italian ancestry are permitted to serve without discrimination.
