



Pfc. John Y. Tanaka To Receive Silver Star Posthumously

The citation reads as follows:
SILVER STAR
"For gallantry in action on 20 January 1945, in the vicinity of the ... France. During a raid on an enemy occupied house, Private Tanaka charged forward, firing his automatic rifle to draw enemy fire away from his comrades. In doing so he was mortally wounded. Summoning his last bit of strength, he fired a burst from his Browning Automatic Rifle, fatally wounding an enemy machine pistol gunner who was endangering the lives of his comrades. Private Tanaka's gallant action was largely responsible for the killing of two Germans and the capturing of 12 others."
The award will be made to the father, Mr. Tetsuro Tanaka, of 3635 Marion St., this city.

Chicago Nisei Hero Officer On Hospital Leave

CHICAGO.—Lt. Harold Tsukano, 29, was hospitalized with the all-Japanese American 442nd Central Postal Directory, spending a hospital leave at the home of his father, Toyokuro Tsukano, at 1333 N. LaSalle St., a retired importer. He was wounded April 11 in Italy and returned to the United States for hospitalization at the Harmon General Hospital, Longview, Tex.
After the war, Lt. Tsukano said, he plans to go into the importing business. "The possibilities of trade in that field with China will be unlimited," he predicted. Because of serious hip and hand wounds, he said he hopes to be discharged soon. He entered the Army before Pearl Harbor.
Lt. Tsukano was a member of a detachment which went to the rescue in France of a lost battalion of the 36th division. The Tsukano family home is in Seattle, Wash., but they were moved here by the WRA. His sister, Mrs. Tony Fujimura, works for the WRA here.

Forfeiture of Alien Held Land Is Sought

FRESNO.—James M. Thuesen, district attorney, said he had ready for filing in the Fresno County Superior Court several new suits seeking forfeiture of alien Japanese held agricultural land.
"Some of the new cases involve large holdings, he disclosed, and three are awaiting court hearings."

Thuesen expressed an opinion that the little commercial property in the county was leased to alien Japanese after the United States abrogated in 1940 a treaty with Japan. He said that the property was being used for commercial purposes to alien Japanese is illegal. Thuesen interprets the ruling to cover only such leases as the treaty abrogation.

BUY WAR BONDS AND WAR STAMPS

Nisei Troops Will Be Strategic Res.

ROME.—The United States 442nd Infantry Regiment, composed of Americans of Japanese descent who fought with distinction in Italy and France, will become part of the strategic reserve when it returns to the United States, Army headquarters announced last week.
The announcement was made to correct a previous report that the 442nd— which will be one of the last American units to leave the Mediterranean theater— would become part of the tactical reserve for the Pacific war. The tactical reserve is held in close support for combat duty.

Army Officers Score And Nisei Sentiment

VAN NUYS, Calif.—Two Los Angeles County Army officers, home from combat, talked with some of their wounded buddies last week and agreed they did not like what they found on the home front— discrimination of the families of those with whom they fought side by side overseas.
Both professed bitterly against what they termed "the American race hatred we have found at home."
In a reunion at the Army's Birmingham Hospital, Van Nuys, Capt. George H. Grandstaff, 35, of Azusa and 1st Lt. Norman C. Mitchell, 33, of 250 Hauser Blvd., Los Angeles, talked over combat experiences with a group of Japanese American patients who had served in the same outfit with them in Italy, France and Germany.
Capt. Grandstaff visited his former Nisei friends to gather additional material for a series of talks he had been ordered by the War Department to give in the Los Angeles and San Francisco areas to combat racial intolerance.
The two officers and the enlisted men had been members of the 442nd Infantry Regiment, which included the famous 100th Battalion of Nisei infantrymen. The 442nd is composed of Nisei volunteers who came largely from the Japanese American internment camps. A close bond of comradeship exists between them.

Doi to Be Inducted

AUBURN (Placer Co.)— Sumio Doi, Nisei farmer, whose return to Placer County last January led to charges of terrorism against four men, is scheduled to leave Auburn today for induction into the United States Army at Camp Bear River, Utah.
Doi and George Masato Yamakawa of Chicago, Ill., are listed by the Placer County Selective Service Board as among 40 persons scheduled for departure. They are first Japanese Americans to be drafted from Placer County since February, 1942.
Doi was classified 1-A by his draft board last Spring, following his return to California. He appealed the classification but it was sustained by the appeal board in Sacramento.
Yamakawa, a former Placer County resident, now lives in Chicago.

CHICAGO.—Their romance blossomed in a relocation camp at Manzanar, Calif., but after they were married and moved to Chicago her husband developed traits of cruelty, Mrs. Kimako Kumagai, 30, of 1511 E. 65th St., an American-born Japanese, told Judge Charles A. Williams in Superior Court recently. She is a beauty operator, and Judge Williams said she made more money than her husband, Howard, also an American-born Japanese, who is a mechanic. She had asked him to ask her for money and she refused, he would strike her, she said. Judge Williams granted her a divorce.

from wounds received when Nazi machine gun slugs hit him in the jaw. He wears the Purple Heart, ETO ribbon with stars and the Presidential unit citation. He was company executive officer with the Nisei troops.
"A sense of alarm has been growing in me since my return to California," Capt. Grandstaff said.
"It came home to what I thought would be a land of the free; to a people I thought had learned from this war to respect the rights of fellow citizens; to a people who had, I thought, learned that racial discrimination and democracy don't jibe."
"And yet one of the first shocks that struck me in the stomach like a cold bayonet was to find racial prejudice and discrimination against the fathers, mothers, sisters and kindred of the men in my outfit. And I find this same discrimination against even the returned veterans themselves."
"I asked for and received order from the War Department to speak out on this subject. I feel that no one ought to be a better right to do so."
Capt. Grandstaff was a staff officer with the 100th Battalion, which included the best of the most decorated outfit in the history of the U. S. Army. The 442nd Regiment to which his battalion was attached, has been awarded more than 3,000 Purple Hearts, two Presidential Unit Citations, 180 Silver Stars, 218 Bronze Stars, 31 Distinguished Service Crosses, six Legion of Merit medals and 64 Division Citations.
"I trapped and fought with these Japanese American boys for two and a half years," the Captain declared. "And the guts and bravery displayed by them reflect the finest traditions of our Army. These former local boys are more loyal to the United States than many a flag-waving, late-charging Jew in the country tries to persecute the Nisei."
Lt. Mitchell was equally emphatic in his denunciation of that he called "witch hunting by fascist and misguided groups in this country." He said, "I know I speak for every disloyal citizen in Birmingham hospital when I say that your average American GI abhors this discord he finds at home. The fact that Negro and Jewish soldiers at the hospital are treated as equals by all the men. There is no race feeling; it is real democracy."
