LOS ANGELES.—Harry Tanoue is a civilian non-working before Pearl Harbor. He served for WRA district office in Santa Ana. Until recently it was S/Sgt. Harry Tanoue, of the 522d Field Artillery (one of the 442d Regiment's 3 battalions). Harry has a Purple Heart—and he has to use a cane. He has 3 campaign stars—and a brother, James Tanoue, killed in action with the 442d in Italy. He has a bronze star for a suicide mission behind enemy lines—and before the war was a prosperous marine brokerage salesman in L. A. His folks live at Heart Mountain. Well, he's glad to be back, and to go to bat for his fellow Nisei on his new job.

Harry A. Oaski, while still at the veterans hospital in West L. A. was invited to join American Legion, Post 322, in Los Angeles, but they insisted, so he's a regular Legionnaire. Harry is finishing a fine arts course at USC this summer, and has been a counselor in charge of campers at the YMCA summer camp near Lake Arrowhead. He was offered 3 summer jobs, but took none because he is one of the outstanding former boy scouts in the nation, having won 163 out of 105 possible merit badges. He volunteered for the Army in '43 from Gila River, trained with the 100th Battalion, and in '44 was medically discharged. His "girl friend" is a Chinese. His plans of completing US lead to a technical job in Hollywood.

Home again, on furlough, is Pfc. Joe Oklun, glad to be back in Brawley after 6½ months in a German prison camp. Joe has already put back 30 of the pounds he lost in Hitler's custody. Before he reports again for active Army duty on Aug. 15, he is "doing" everything he can to do his fight against Fascism (American style) on the home front. He visited his father, Ekiichi Oklun, at Poston—a happy reunion. Joe entered the Ar-

Naval Plane Serves As Mercy Ship To Save Life of Japanese Infant

NEWELL, Calif.,—WRA and Naval authorities revealed last week that while the United States Army and Navy are raining death and destruction on the Japanese homeland, the Navy threw its resources into a dramatic race against time to save the life of a Japanese American baby in the Tule Lake Relocation Center hospital here.

Ryoko Ogawa, 15-month-old daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Hatajiri Ogawa, formerly Anaheim and Los Angeles, was near death from a rare malady diagnosed as meningitis caused by the virus of influenza. The disease has been 100 per cent fatal except in cases in which a special and recently developed serum has been used.

Srum Was Located

Dr. Jack Sleath, Tule Lake medical officer, searched by telephone for a supply of the serum. He found there was some in the Children's Hospital in San Francisco which offered to divide its supply in a gamble for the baby's life if the serum could be transported to Tule Lake in time.

Commander M. Payne, medical officer of Klamath Falls, Ore., Naval Air Station, stepped into the picture. He arranged an emergency flight by a navy plane to Alameda to pick up the serum.

Plane Makes Trip

Lieutenant D. M. Rathj of the Naval Air Station piloted the mercy plane to Alameda and back and delivered the serum to Dr. Sleath, who was waiting at the air field while Dr. Donnell W. Boardman, senior medical officer at Tule Lake Hospital, sat by the unconscious child. The serum arrived, but the baby's only chance for life.

The first injection was made before 9 p.m. Tuesday and the baby lives today. The child has never been outside the center. She was born here.

Her father, 26 years old, is a native of San Jose and her mother is a native of Hawaii.

Word has just been received that 15-month-old Ryoko Ogawa passed away in spite of the mercy flight undertaken by the Navy Air Station to rush serum to spare her life.

Preacher Offers to Scrap for Nisei McClroy Commends Nisei Troops

SAN JOSE.—Two local Nisei boys, recently returned here with their Issei parents (names withheld for reasons apparent later on in this story) dropped into a downtown restaurant for a late Saturday night snack before returning to their host.

Seated in a booth and minding their own business they were rudely accosted by a bellicose sailor with "three sheets in the wind and the other one flapping" who indulged in more than a bit of braggadocio as he announced that he was a "Jap killer from away back" and intended to polish off the youngsters.

Wishing to avoid a scene, the boys arose to leave. The waitress, remonstrated, urged them to stay, assuring they had as much right there as anybody. She managed to get the drunken sailor put the door.

He returned, renewing his offensive attack of words. But this time a busy minister of the Gospel, a Caucasian, entered and told the sailor off. "If you want to fight Japs, get back aboard your ship and out into the Pacific. There's plenty to be done out there, sailor!"

"It's a good thing you're a preacher," retorted the sailor, "or I'd take a punch at you!"

"If you feel that way about it," replied the minister in business-like tones, "I can shed this coat and reverse this collar in big time!"

The fistfuffs did not materialize as a companion of the sailor dragged him outside, just a jump ahead of the arrival of the Shore Patrol.

The Nisei boys want to come downtown again on Saturday night, so—that's the reason no names are given. They are afraid their parents might object. And the courageous, but modest, "Fightin' Parson" has asked that he remain anonymous.

"Vets Benefits" Booklet Available

Well integrated plans for the readjustment to civilian life of returning service men and service women and for the welfare of their dependents were revealed today by Mr. A. D. Borden, Denver Regional Manager of the Veterans' Administration.

Much misinformation about these plans, which are adaptable to the needs and desires of veterans, and the details of the present laws governing proper administration of this program, is prevalent, Mr. Borden said.

A great deal of inaccurate and incomplete data on this general subject has been due to present commercial sale of pamphlets, Mr. Borden added.

To counteract this and to provide authentic information on the many phases of veterans' welfare, Veterans' Administration Pamphlet No. 44 entitled "Veterans Benefits" has been published. It may be purchased from the Superintendent of Documents, Washington 25, D. C., at fifteen cents per copy. The pamphlet is not available at the Veterans' Administration, Mr. Borden emphasized.

The Veterans' Administration strongly urges veterans' service centers, educational institutions, service organizations and others to avail themselves of this pamphlet.
