Army Appeals Decision in Individual Exclusion Case

LOS ANGELES. — Last week [ility] of the exclusion orders themselves, Judge Hall, after an extended trial, in a lengthy opinion ruled that the military authorities acted beyond their constitutional power when they issued military exclusion orders excluding any person from any of the military areas on the Pacific Coast. Editor of The Bee—Sir: Today I open my copy of the Stars and Stripes and settled back to read and enjoy the news from home. In a few moments I was filled not with pleasure but anger and shame as a result of reading two articles—about veterans restoring the desecrated Japanese graveyard at Stockton, and about Walnut Grove woman being failed in Sacramento for a tirade against the Japanese.

What possible excuse can there be for such blind stupidity and senseless hatred among Americans? These are not the first such articles I have read about veterans from every part of the country. When I left Sacramento (with the blessings of Draft Board 25) I hoped to return some day in the future. Now I'm not so sure.

Since newspapers all over the world have praised the exploits of the Japanese Americans after I will say that no man should dare ever to be one of these boys in front of any of the survivors of the now famous "Lost Battalion" of the 36th Division. I assure you it would not be healthy.

No one who was there and saw that valiant rescue could say anything but praise for those

men who had one of the dirtiest jobs of the war and who did it out in such a fine manner.

This is not intended to be a preachment, nor is it an attempt to voice the noble sentiments of a politician. It is merely the protest of an ordinary citizen soldier who protests most ardently against such actions by people who must be ignorant if not actually stupid.

To the 15 veterans who helped restore the desecrated graveyard, my best regards and respect. You are not alone in your fair view, men. Keep up the good work.


