RACE CALLED SOLE ISSUE IN S. F. BROKER'S CASE

SAN FRANCISCO. — A hearing called "clearly discriminatory" by the American Civil Liberties Union was held here last Thursday to determine if Japanese aliens were qualified for a real estate broker's license.

"There was no 'racial issue' in the three-hour hearing at the State Division of Real Estate's San Francisco office, according to G. K. Nye, the hearing officer.

But Ernest Besig, director of the Civil Liberties Union, said there was "no other issue but race."

The case involved Nobusuke Nakashishi, 45, of 2031 Pine St., who returned last March from Topaz, after three years' detention in that center.

Before his evacuation in 1942, Nakashishi was a real estate broker here.

In March, he applied for a broker's license, a procedure which Besig declared "usually takes about 10 days."

His hearing was scheduled for April 10 by Hubert C. Sonder, State Real Estate Commissioner, to test the applicant's "honesty, truthfulness and good reputation."

Seven witnesses testified that Nakashishi, who had held a real estate broker's license prior to the Japanese evacuation order, had had a good reputation.

His attorney, Hart Clinton, sought to show that there was "prejudice on the part of the State Commissioner against the Japanese" by calling the witness statement of Commissioner's deputy, Ralph C. Harrison, who, with Carl W. Wynnkoop, deputy State Attorney General, had questioned Nakashishi and the witnesses.

Clinton sought to establish how many German, Italian, Bulgarian and Romanian enemy aliens had been interrogated on their applications for a license.

But Wynnkoop objected to the questions, saying the hearing was only to establish Nakashishi's reputation and not the method of the real state commissioner.

Nye sustained the objection.

Clinton replied only one enemy

alien, an Italian, had been ordered to appear for a hearing and his application had been approved.

Nakashishi had been placed on the American "cleared list" of the War Defense Command, one witness, J. H. Turner of the War Relocation Authority, testified.

"These Japanese have been the most investigated group in the three-hour hearing at the State Division of Real Estate's San Francisco office, according to G. K. Nye, the hearing officer.

But Ernest Besig, director of the Civil Liberties Union, said there was "no other issue but race."

Heart Mtn. Evacuees Appeal Conviction Under Draft Law

LOS ANGELES. — Raising the issue of free speech, free press and free assembly, a brief filed in behalf of Frank Iwamoto, 26, of the Heart Mountain evacuees in the Tent Circuit Court of Appeals at Denver, Colorado, urged that their conviction for conspiracy to evade the draft law be set aside, on the ground that their rights under the First Amendment were violated when filed last week. Frank Emi, as well as Kiyoshi Okamoto, Paul T. Nakadate, Teutomo Wakaye, Minoru Tanemasa, Isamu Horine, and Goro Kubota, all Heart Mountain evacuees, were sentenced to the Heart Mountain relocation Center, were sentenced after a trial at Cheyenne, Wyoming, to penitentiary sentences running from two to four years.

They were all leaders of the Fair Play Committee along similar lines constituted a conspiracy to violate the draft law, according to the Government; they urged the defendants to accept the draft, to whom they appealed, and the WRA detention. ACLU Will Aid in California State Board Permit Case

LOS ANGELES. — The American Civil Liberties Union, Southern California Branch, has announced that it will cooperate in a test case in the court of the State Board of Equalization, which will determine if the Japanese detainees, who were discriminated against by the State Board of Equalization in any application to secure permits, in connection with the collection of the Selective Training and Service Act.

The price of a permit is \$1, and Americans applicants receive these permits as a matter of routine.

Social Welfare

LOS ANGELES. — Public and private welfare agencies in the 9 counties of Southern California do not discriminate with the exception of Imperial County, which so far has held up requests.)

Social Security Board "resentitlement assistance" funds, administered by counties, take care of emergency needs.

WRA case summaries help determine legal residence. Then, on arrival in the country, personal application, file, with assistance of WRA district offices.

Those having social welfare needs should not hesitate to inquire. Remember—there is no discrimination on the part of social welfare agencies, either public or private.
