

Little Tokyo Showing Signs Of Old Activity

LOS ANGELES. — Little Tokyo is coming to life again in Los Angeles as the hub of Japanese activity, but probably will never again reach its pre-war Japanese population; the WRA offices here disclosed last week.

More than 300 of the 40,000 evacuated from the congested Japanese colony in the shadow of the Civic Center are back here.

Ten business houses already have opened up in the Little Tokyo area among the 20,000 Nisei who began moving in early 1942, most of them from the Deep South and attracted by high wages in war plants. East First street is the business center for the returning Japanese.

When they arrive—and they are coming in every day from eight WRA Centers—they invariably go to the Koyasan Buddhist Center at 214 East First St. Until the city health authorities cracked down recently, more than 100 Nisei gathered in the temple. Most of these were forced to find other quarters.

The No. 1 man of the new Japanese colony is "Frank" E. Nishi, a well-to-do and highly educated, a resident

of Los Angeles for 35 years. He was sent here last January to pave the way for returning evacuees. He was born in Japan.

Toya is trying to find housing for his people, to locate jobs for them and to help them start up in business. Store facilities are lacking, but already on East First street are a Japanese 5-and-10, fruit, vegetable and fish markets, a cosmetic shop, a barber shop and one dentist.

It is lack of housing that has kept the population down to 300—However, those who have returned hope to stay. They find they get along all right with the Negro population. One educated Nisei said he has sounded out tempers here, finds the outlook better than he had about, and will return to Chicago soon to bring his family back.

Over a stretch of two blocks on East First street one finds Japanese men, women and children standing in groups as they did of old. At the Pilgrim House Community Center on San Pedro street slant-eyed little boys and girls and Negro children play together.

Japanese Double Talk Stumps Nisei

TOKYO. — A Japanese American in our Army, serving as liaison between the Japanese and Los Angeles asked eagerly: "What did they say?"

The Nisei shrugged his shoulders and smiled: "It beats hell out of me."

Drop in Nisei Colony Seen for West Coast

SAN FRANCISCO. — Approximately 45,000 Japanese Americans will resettle on the Pacific Coast as compared with 110,000 before the war, R. B. Cozzens, Assistant Director of the WRA, said last week.

Complete revocation of the exclusion order, announced by War Department will not affect WRA activities. Mr. Cozzens said. "WRA will assist in finding homes and employment for the 45,000 Japanese Americans still in the centers."

Nearly 12,000 Japanese Americans have already resettled on the West Coast. Mr. Cozzens said. "The centers have been set for closing relocation centers, the centers from the various centers."

Nationalism In All Directions

One of the queerest things about race prejudices is the way they are held by people who are themselves victims of race prejudice. At a meeting to which I was invited some time ago, I was told that there are many Japanese Americans who, although vigorously protesting race prejudice when it applied to them, had strong prejudices themselves against other minorities such as Mexican, Negroes and Jews.

The Japanese American Citizens League is combating such prejudices among their own group with the veritable argument, "How do you expect others to stop being prejudiced against you if you insist on having similar prejudices yourself?"

Unfortunately, the point is hard to get across to many members of minority groups. The reason is not far to seek. The victim of discrimination is simply consoling himself by finding someone else to discriminate against.

"Nothing, don't," the women replied. "We don't want to work with any Japs."

The employer, however, was so short of help that he finally hired the Japanese American girl working with them.

"After a few days the Negroes discovered that the little Japanese girl was not so stupid and began to speak to her. She replied politely, so that soon she had many friends among the Negro employees."

She did it too.

One day, one of the Negro women who had become especially friendly with the Japanese girl took her aside and said to her, "We have an apology to make to you. Before you came here, the boss told us he was hiring a Japanese American girl. We all objected to your coming, because we were prejudiced against Japanese."

"Now that we have seen you and talked to you, we have got over our prejudice. And we want to ask you to forgive us for having been so stupid and prejudiced."

The Japanese girl was deeply touched by their words.

"I'm awfully glad you people like me," she said, "because I like all of you and I like working here." Then her tone changed. "I especially like being here because before I came I was working for a bunch of Jew and I hate Jews."

Four Nisei Veterans Donate Funds to FDR Memorial

WASHINGTON. — The WRA announced last Saturday that 4 American-born Japanese veterans of the 442nd Central Postal Directory Team will present \$4,300 to President Truman this week to be used for a memorial to the memory of the late President Franklin D. Roosevelt.

The money was raised through contributions from members of the 442nd.

The veterans will be the president with Secretary of Interior Harold I. Ickes, WRA Administrator Dillon Meyer and Earl M. Finch, Hattiesburg, Miss., farmer.

They are Private First Class Jesse Hirata, 26, of Honolulu, T. H., holder of a Distinguished Service Cross; Sergeant Veiko Kuykuyama, 25, Long Island, N. Y., holder of the Silver Star; Private First Class Teruo Kato, 20, of Honolulu, who lost his right leg in the Italian campaign; and Private First Class George Tsujimoto, 25, of Tracy, Calif., who was wounded in the Italian campaign.

All four veterans wear the purple heart.

Kin of S. F. Nisei Servicemen Get Richmond Housing

SAN FRANCISCO. — Ten Japanese American military members in the armed forces last Saturday moved into housing units at the Richmond Housing project.

The move was in line with national housing laws which give priority to servicemen in renting public housing vacated by war workers.

The WRA and the Federal Public Housing Administration requested the Richmond accommodations for the Nisei.

It is feared that less than 20,000 Japanese Canadians listed in the Dominion as of last February, approximately 10,000 have signed their desire to return to Japan, a percentage much higher than in the United States.

Placer Board Denies County Aid To Returnees

AUBURN (Placer Co.). — The Placer County Board of Supervisors has adopted an official policy of refusing relief to alien Japanese who return to the county from any of the WRA camps.

The policy is embodied in a resolution adopted by the supervisors last week when a request for county aid for an unnamed elderly Japanese was denied.

The request for aid was presented to the board by Mrs. Belle Wilson, county welfare director. She said the case had been referred to her by the state department of welfare to whom it had been referred originally by the WRA.

The elderly Japanese had been employed in ranch work in Placer County from 1929 until the army ordered removal of all persons of Japanese ancestry from coastal areas after Pearl Harbor. During his absence, it was stated, he has developed a malady which will prevent him from working during the remainder of his life.

The supervisors previously 2 months ago turned down a request for aid by a Japanese couple who returned from a WRA camp to their ranch near Lees Ferry. In that case the couple sold their property and left Placer County.
