

California Alien Land Law To Be Contested

LOS ANGELES. — With the filing in the San Diego superior court of a Notice of Appeal by the Oyamas, through their attorney, A. L. Wirin, last week an appeal was taken to the California Supreme Court from the ruling of the San Diego Superior Court Judge Joe Shell, upholding the California Alien Land Law. After a trial last August, Judge Shell ordered a small Chula Vista farm escheated to the State of California as against Fred Oyama and his father Kiyoshi Oyama. This order was made despite the father's taking out guardianship proceedings in connection with the property. As explained by Judge Shell, he made the ruling because of the provisions of the California Alien Land Law, which not only prohibits Japanese aliens from owning land, but also grants a legal presumption that land taken in the name of a minor by a Japanese alien, is presumed to be in violation of the Alien Land Law.

WRA Student Record Transcripts To Be Transferred to Washington

WASHINGTON. — Following an agreement reached between WRA Director Myers and the U. S. Commissioner of Education, WRA student record transcripts will be transferred to the U. S. Office of Education on March 30, 1946. It was announced that from that time on, former WRA students requiring these transcripts for official credit should address all requests for transcripts to that office. It is expected that this service will last several years.

Deportation Pleas Of Nisei May Be Reviewed

WASHINGTON. — Because many letters of protest have been received, a House Immigration Subcommittee planned last week to ask a review of the cases of many Japanese-Americans who have been marked for deportation to Japan for renouncing their United States citizenship. Chairman Dickstein (D.) N. Y., said his committee will ask Attorney General E. A. Tamm to provide hearings for Nisei who contend they never desired to surrender constitutional rights or be classed as Japanese nationals.

Burbank, California Opposes Quarters of Japanese Americans

BURBANK, Calif. — Irate residents of Burbank joined their City Councilman at a meeting last week in protesting the proposed use of vacated Army barracks in Glen Oaks Park as a Nisei relocation center. Already, it was learned, Burbank city officials are preparing termination-of-lease papers to be presented to the government in their efforts to clear the barracks from the park and begin development of recreation facilities which reportedly have been planned for two years.

Japanese POWs To Work in Cal. Cotton Fields

TULARE, Cal. — Assignment of Japanese prisoners of war to work in San Joaquin valley cotton fields has been approved by the Project Manager, General Congressman Alfred J. Elliott, said last week in Tulare. A total of 3000 prisoners will supplement, at one assignment, German POWs assigned to the harvest. Japanese will be housed in 2 camps. Two thousand will arrive at Kings Canyon camp Oct. 3 and the rest will arrive at Kern county camp Oct. 7 and 8. Valley farmers, faced with their normal shortage of agricultural labor, recently met in Denver to ask more prisoners.

Rock Is Tossed Into Home of Seattle Japanese

SEATTLE. — Isoko Takahashi, 22-year-old Japanese American student at the University of Washington, was injured in the front room of her home last Monday night when a rock came crashing through the window. The missile hit a service flag hanging for her brother, Mitsuru, wearer of the Purple Heart and veteran of two major battles in Italy, who is still overseas.

Internees Jailed For Bugle Blowing Are Freed at Tule Lake

LOS ANGELES. — Five Japanese American boys 15 to 17 years old who were sentenced to nine months in jail at the Tule Lake segregation center for blowing bugles, shaving their heads, and honoring for Japan, were released August 28, after the Northern California Branch of the American Civil Liberties Union had intervened in their behalf. The California Branch had filed petitions for habeas corpus in the federal court demanding that the boys be released without pre-trial, since the camp superintendent made his own rules, acted as

L. A. Supervisors Cite Housing Shortage; Ask Centers Be Kept

LOS ANGELES. — A mass discharge of some 22,000 Japanese-Americans from relocation centers within the next 60 days may cause serious trouble in the Los Angeles County area because of inadequate facilities to house them. This fear was expressed last Friday in a resolution adopted by the Board of Supervisors asking the Federal Government to taper the release of Japanese from the centers close. Dept. 1.

Pacific Transport Arrives in L. A. With Nisei Hero Aboard

LOS ANGELES. — Among the 1456 passengers, mostly fighting men from the South Pacific, was Lt. Roy Uyehata, 27, of Gilroy, California, Japanese American youth who has been in the United States Army for four and one-half years with 34 months overseas service in the South Pacific including Guadalcanal, the Solomons, Bougainville and the Philippines. The passengers arrived at the Los Angeles Port of Embarkation this week aboard the Dutch motorship Huzandam. Lt. Uyehata was the Bronze Star for his work as interpreter, interrogating Japanese prisoners of war and has 99 points toward discharge from the Army.
