

12th Annual Young People's Christian Confab Plans Under Way

"Living Creatively" To Be Theme and Will Be Held Thanksgiving Week-End, November 23-25

The long-awaited 12th Annual Young People's Christian Conference of the Inter-Mountain Circuit, which had been limited to the local groups of Denver for the last three years due to wartime restrictions, will be held once again in Denver during the Thanksgiving week-end, Nov. 23rd to 25th. The purpose of the Conference is to unite all Japanese American Christians in the Rocky Mountain area and to promote their mutual fellowship together. The California Street Community Church of Denver will be the host to the delegates to this three-day party. Invitations are being extended to all Nisei Christians throughout Colorado, Wyoming, Nebraska, New Mexico and Utah.

US To Deport Nisei Who Renounce Citizenship

LOS ANGELES. — Deportation to Japan of 5,500 citizens of Japanese ancestry who renounced their citizenship during the war under a special act of Congress appears to be certain despite some doubts as to the legal status of many of them. Although they renounced U. S. citizenship only those became Japanese subjects who had dual citizenship. Many apparently became stateless, and the legal question arises whether the U. S. government can deport to Japan stateless persons of Japanese ancestry. Court proceedings are now necessary to determine the point, or Congressional action might settle the issue. The power of Congress to deport citizens is unquestioned and it is presumed that Japan would be obliged to accept them.

Civil Liberties Union has filed a number of cases of men who renounced citizenship under what appeared to be duress by the pro-Japanese elements at the Tule Lake center, with a view to having them exempted from deportation.

Washington Post: Relocation Funds

In a strangely incoherent report the House Appropriations Committee has recommended a reduction of five million dollars of the funds which Congress last spring made available to the War Relocation Authority for the 1946 fiscal year. These funds were to be used to maintain camps for the Japanese American evacuees from the West Coast by the Army in 1942, to promote resettlement of the evacuees and to assist them in getting reestablished in new communities. WRA has pushed ahead in its program with all the speed that could be considered consistent with humanity and justice. Two thirds of the \$5,000,000 evacuees who were eligible for relocation have already been relocated. But some 2,000 to 3,000 are still in the WRA camps. It is expected that they will be moved out at a rate of about 1,000 a month till the end of the year—which is as fast a movement as transportation facilities will permit—and that the majority will be substantially completed by that time.

The Appropriations Committee, according to its report, feels, however, that liquidation should proceed more rapidly and that those responsible therefore are not proceeding to liquidate as speedily as they should; that here is too much of a disposition to confer and "dilly-dally" on a reduction of funds—which is likely to result in a reduction of personnel—can serve to accelerate the work of the agency, it is extremely difficult to figure out. Another WRA is in lieu of the schedule it presented on the very same committee when it obtained its appropriation last year.

What appears to have been the committee's real motivation is disclosed in the statement that the cut in funds may have the effect of reducing, as it is expected, contemplated further support of the activity administered by the Social Security Board. This refers to relief assistance granted to evacuees when they come out of the camps and until they are entitled to their livelihoods by military order and for a term of years imprisonment in detention centers. They are guilty of no crime. They are in the most literal sense, victims—victims of what was said to be an exigency of war. As such, they are entitled at the very least to assistance in rehabilitating themselves. The United States cannot evade its responsibility to these people without incurring a solemn moral obligation.

WASHINGTON. — Evacuees having accounts with the Yokohama Specie Bank are now advised that dividend payments may start next long after October 1, 1945, according to word received here from George H. Mills, who is liquidating the bank under the direction of the Commissioner of Banking of the State of California.

Evacuees are asked to discontinue writing letters of inquiry regarding payment, since the time and money involved in answering them will affect the amount of dividends payable.

In addition, Mr. Mills suggested that claims should be made as soon as possible. He estimates that to date only about 50 per cent of the depositors have filed claims. Continued delay in filing may slow up liquidation and payment of dividends.

Claims are to be filed with the Commissioner of Banking, State of California, San Francisco. An application for a 1-month eviction notice. Also, "new buyers" who are war veterans on "hardship cases" may apply for a reduction of their 6-months eviction notice on homes; OPA will decide each case of this kind on individual merits and may reduce the time necessary for eviction to as little as one month.

Second Tea Crop Being Harvested at Fort Morgan, Colo.

GREELEY. — George H. Kato, American Japanese who made Colorado agricultural history by harvesting two acres of tea at Fort Morgan last year, will harvest four acres of the crop this season. The tea acreage is on one of the Walter Ott farms. It is estimated the crop may gross \$1800 an acre in tea and tea seed returns.

The tea is not the type used in the United States, which is harvested from a perennial bush, but grown on an annual bush and is used largely by Japanese and Chinese. Kato's crop will probably be shipped by the buyers to the Hawaiian Islands because demand for the crop of United States was due to war conditions which prevented shipments from the Orient, that may be the last season that the crop will be a profitable one in the United States.
