Placer Co. Brothers Acquitted In Terror Raid Case

SACRAMENTO—James and Claude Watson, Auburn, Calif., brothers, were acquitted last Friday by the federal grand jury of charges of illegal possession of dynamite and conspiracy to violate a federal law.
Previously, the brothers had been acquitted of similar charges in the Placer County Superior Court.
After the jury returned its not guilty verdict, Federal Judge Martin I. Welch ordered the brothers released and their \$1,500 bail exonerated.
United States Attorney Frank J. Hennessy, who prosecuted the case, told the jury in his final argument the "entire nation is watching the outcome of this case." He said the nation desires to know whether California is going to guarantee the Japanese protection from "terror raids."

Calif. Sanatorium Seeks Removal of Alien Japanese

WEIMAR, Calif.—The governing board of the Weimar Joint Sanatorium has asked the United States immigration authorities to remove 15 alien Japanese patients.
Dr. Mildred Thoren, medical superintendent, reported to the board in session here the text of a resolution she had drafted at the board's direction on September 6th. At that time Dr. Thoren was given blanket authority to ask for the removal of alien Japanese on the ground the institution's rooms and beds are needed urgently for American citizens.

No mention was made of persons of Japanese ancestry who are citizens of the United States.

Judge Sentences Nisei For Evading Induction Here

Four Japanese Americans, 3 of them brothers, who refused to report to the Fort Lupton draft board for induction into the armed services in June, were sentenced Monday to two and a half years in a federal penitentiary by U. S. District Judge Symes after they had pleaded noia contendere.

In a plea for leniency, evidence was offered that the four, Atsushi Archie Amati, Takao Ishimoto, Harry Kenji Ishimoto, and George Kenichi Ishimoto, all of La Salle, Colo., had changed their minds and volunteered for service, but U. S. District Attorney Morrissey stated this offer had come only after peace had been signed between this country and Japan. The defendants had been indicted by a federal grand jury Sept. 19.

Nisei GIs From All Parts of World Enjoy 'Cross Road Frolic

SAN FRANCISCO—Under the auspices of the JACL, International Institute, YWCA and CIO, a Hospitality Party for Nisei GIs and their friends were held at the CIO Servicemen's Center Saturday, Oct. 6.
Eighty-one Nisei hostesses paid 50 cents to entertain over a hundred Nisei servicemen from Camp Stoneman, the Presidio of San Francisco and Monterey, Ft. Mason, Camp Beale, Dibble General Hospital, and Letterman. Mixing in the party of merry-makers were members of the 442nd Regiment, who are awaiting discharge, veterans from the Pacific theater, and Nisei sergeants and lieutenants awaiting embarkation orders as occupational troops. Among friends mingling in the group was Seaman C. J. Frechburg, battle casualty when a "kamikaze" struck his ship.
Under the chairmanship of June Tokuyama, Akiyo Sakai, Alice Takeuchi, and Mari Okazaki, Nisei girls of the Bay area planned this gala festival for the GI's stationed in the city.

PORTLAND—Reed College last week announced the award of scholarships to three freshmen of Japanese descent, all born in the United States and graduates of American high schools.
Funds for the scholarships were given by Portland businessmen and ministers. The three winners were chosen by the college from a list of 15 applicants, all in need of financial help.
A \$600 scholarship was awarded to Walter Miyagi of Newell, Cal., and awards for \$325 each to Lillian Michimoto and Richard Sakurai. Sakurai started college at Miami university, Oxford, Ohio, a year ago but had to drop out for lack of funds.

Court Issues Order in Alien Land Act Suit

AUBURN, Calif.—Superior Judge Lowell L. Sparks issued an order permitting service of summons by publication in the recent proceedings instituted by Attorney General Robert Kenny and District Attorney C. E. Tindall against Sangato and Euko Kondo last April.
The defendants have not returned to the action, which charges violation of the California Alien Land Act.

Formation of Civil Rights Com. Mooted

SAN FRANCISCO—In a series of two meetings called to discuss the infringement upon civil and citizenship rights, particularly in respect cases, local residents of Japanese ancestry met again Oct. 1 at the Sturgeon Memorial Hotel. JACL Region 1 Representative, Joe Grant Maekawa, related the numerous cases now being the subject of litigation.
Among those present were parents of servicemen whose lands might possibly be affected by the excheat cases now being prosecuted by the State. The sentiment was expressed that their eligibility to citizenship jeopardized upon the property rights of their sons who are American citizens.
Statements were expressed that such excheat proceedings in effect constituted acts of "terrorism" against citizens. Discussing the situation, a special fund be set up to participate in combating these excheat cases.
