Josh, its sure good to know that this is going to be the last year in camp. Boy, its a good thing! Boy, the people are shot, too! They notice every thing about you. Gossip is all that is being talked about. If I would be in camp another year, I'd go crazy! People are too darn narrow minded!

All of my pals are gradually relocating and I don't have any body to go to anywhere with. The express office is pretty well filled with things which people are sending out before they do

relocate again. Kids are
gradually checking out of school.
See, its going to be a happy day
when its the time for me to
pack.

Just next month and school
will be out. I know the
months will fly by, and will
soon go home.

Oh yes! we're having another
annual this year but it is
moreless what you would call
a pamphlet. I ordered you
one so will be sure you
get one. Its 75¢!

See, I guess I have really
been looking forward to going
to Los Angeles because I
have been home in Los
Angeles around ten times in
dreams. See, now would
tell me that I'd be yelling
in my dreams & laughing
and what nots! Yes, you
probably would hear me

God, the way I talk in my sleep. I bet you can already imagine this, huh!

I can hardly wait till we do get home. If the Affonters don't cause us any trouble with our house and say that they can't find a place to live, I'm sure we'll be heading home in July. Gee, if you get your furlough in August, as you think, I'm sure you would come home to W.L.C., a real home, where we could play the piano together and try to cook & wash dishes together & even sleep together! Boy, I sure do miss you & Doc. I think that you were the ones who really made me happy. Especially the fights!

Truly, it would be swell
if you could come home
at the same time you do.
Then we'd reunite together
as a whole family like
the times before you relocated
from the Manzanar dump!

Easter was lousy! Man,
it blew so you could hardly
see the next barrack. It
blew all afternoon. It's a
good thing I didn't have any
new Easter clothes! I didn't
go to the Sunrise Service
for the first time since
I came to Manzanar. I just
slept + went to the young
people's service. I quit going
to Sunday School. Gee, that
dust was an inch thick
all over the room clear up
to the partition + boy that's
really dirty! Well so long,
& I hope you'll write again!
