This morning we got the post card telling about the radio broadcast. It must have been very interesting to watch something you have never seen before.

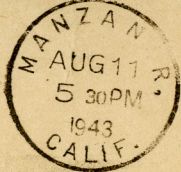

Moma said they ate omusashi (rigid) cake, oranges, pokes & other stuff. She said it lasted good eating by the creek. She came home by supper time and Moma showed her the pictures that you sent. the picture of George Sakata. She was glad that George is okay. Ma gave her the picture with you and George and the girls in it. She ate supper with us & then rested & went home. After that I tried to play badminton with Lily Odakara but there was a sad case it was too windy.
