Little Rock--"Proposals that Japanese-American students from two evacuation centers in Arkansas be admitted to Arkansas universities and colleges have met strong opposition from state officials. Ralph B. Jones, Arkansas education commissioner said the proposal, made by the National Japanese-American Relocation Council of Philadelphia, is 'an unjustifiable demand of Arkansas and students of various schools' The commissioner said trustees of two state colleges have adopted resolutions opposing the admission of Japanese-American students to their institutions." --San Francisco News, Aug. 21, p. 24, col. 4. #1309

"Japs to Leave Santa Anita"

Calif. San Francisco--"Transfer of more than 19,000 Japanese evacuees now residing at Santa Anita racetrack to inland relocation centers will begin next Wednesday, the WCCA announced today." According to an announcement from Col. Karl P. Bendetsen the initial movement from Santa Anita "will comprise 1,200 Japanese, most of them families evacuated from the San Diego area."
