STOCKTON FAMILY HEADS VOLUNTEERS

Approximately 110 voluntary Stockton Assembly Center. the headed by Y. Nichimoto and his family of nine, left on Friday at 7 p.m. for Sholley, Idaho, to work in the bootfields of the Utah-Idaho Sugar Co.

Their transportation was provided by Utah-Idaho Sugar Company, who through their representative, lin. Haynes, and Hr. Wood of the United States Employment Service, obtained evacuos la-bor for the Idaho boot farmers. Volunsocie of wages toors will be paid the Scorotary of Agriculture, sot by the Claudo A. Wickard, for that locality. Minimum rates per nere for thinning is \$2.50; \$9.50; for first hooing, \$1.50; and 45¢ an hour second hooing, for all day work.

The workers will be paid 55% per hour for topping and loading, while on the tennage basis they will be \$1.55 per ton up to six tons and \$1.10 per ton up to 18 tons and over. If topping and loading are done separately, of the rate per ten will be paid

to the leader.

Workers will be provided with free but they must obtain and propare their own meals,
