Flourishing a wooden model of an incendiary bomb. Collard declared that the incendiary bombs, composed of an inner core of ther-mite and an outer casing of magnesium, are dropped from planes in sticks--10 bombs to each stick--about every 60 feet.

MILITARY OBJECTIVE

Since the center is located near a military objective, the air field, bombs aimed at the air field may fell in the center.

He said that the first move after an incendiary bomb falls through a building is to get the occupants out. The next move is to control the fire. He mentioned the two methods of incendiary controlling bombs -- by sand and by a fine spray of water, which makes the bomb burn faster. DON'T USE CHEMICALS

also emphatically He stated not to dump a bucket of water on a bomb, since the bomb will then explode and spread the fire. Then again, chemicals should not be used on incendiary bomb, because the combination of the chemical and the bomb will produce carbon monoxa poisonous gas.
