On what may be a prelude to mass relocation of Jepanese in all assembly centers, the Western Defense Command Headquarters issued orders for evacuation of 4,800 persons from Walerga (Sac'to) Center, beginning June 15, and 2,500 persons from Marysville Center, beginning June 24, to Tulelake Relocation Center (expecity of 10,000) in Northern California. 1. Twielake in Sorthern California (10,000), potatoes, field pecs, smill gardens, forest products, canning and dehydrating plants.

2. Manager (10,000), guayule plantations, small plantations, small industries, public works.

3. Perker Lem in Southern Arizona (27,000), irrigation projects, production of aubsistence food crops.

4. Gils in Southern Arizons (16,000), irrigation projects, production of subsistence from crops.

 Minicoke in Southern Ideho (10,000), ichigetien projects, sugar beets, potutoes, beens and outons.

 The X-Y reach country, 100 miles east of Pueblo in Colorado (7,000).


