COMPULSORY EDUCATION TO BE GIVEN

A minimum requirement of six hours per week at school and physical education classes proposed by the Education Department, will be expected of all those ranging from 6-16 years old who are physically able and not employed. This ruling which is backed by councilmen, juvenile officers, and the Social Welfare Department, will go into effect immediately.

Among those who have aided in thes project of relocating students al-ready are various national student organizations, foundations, state universities, independent colleges and national church boards.






Baby Bathing Proves Popular
