Relocation Policy Explained

The policy concerning applications for transfer and relocation has announced by Harwood P. stump of the Service Divi-

sion. Instructions are

follows:

1. Transfers between Centers -- recent instruc-tions permit the transfer of only such persons as family and or those persons who, because of their relationship and physical conditions, are dependent upon relatives or certain friends for their care, shall be eligible transfer. for

Requests transfer of persons to or from given centers to complete a family circle shall be made to the Wel-

fare Department.

2. Requested release to accept employment in inland states or to attend school--applications of this nature shall be made to the welfare office for referral to the proper authorities. However, no release under present conditions will be granted except after referral to proper army officials.

The people are asked not to request that a doctor be sent out on calls unioss the case is very ursont and necessary. Due the five-doctor staff. they are kopt busy attending these in special clinics, and caring for all who need medical treatment. In addition to the night duties, each doctor is busy at the disponsary. the proper procedure, therefore, amounced by the hospital, is to put in a call for the ambulance where immodiate service is assured the people.

All omergency cases are able to be taken care of with the supplies on hand, but in the event that special drugs are not available, private purchases by the individual will provide the drugs.

Abusing the privilege of free medication by raking unnecessary roquests should be eliminated in this Center. Other than emergency cases, medical requests should be confined to the scheduled dispensary hours.
