### FOURTEEN COUNCILMEN ELECTED; 5 UNITS TO REVOTE JUNE 11

Eleven Candidates Renew Political Campaign, Thurs.

ELECTION HELD HIGHLY SUCCESSFUL; CLOSE RACE EXPECTED IN REVOTE

As provided in the "Election Instructions," revotes will be held June 11, from 8 a. m. to 8 p. m. Run-offs will be held for the following who failed to win a simple majority. They are accorded 60 days to win: Revotes, Thursday, June 11

Fourteen councilmen out of the required twenty, representing two from ten units, were elected in yesterday's election was revealed last night.

Due to the lack of plurality, six councilmen from five units, namely B, G, K, L and M will hold another election on Thursday, June 11 to choose another officer for the hotly contested post.

# TABULATION OF VOTES

# 71 PERCENT GO TO POLLS E-SECTION TAKES HIGH HONORS WITH 97 PERCENT

Of the 3,243 eligible voters, 2,314 or 71.35% cast their ballots in yesterday's election. Having the highest percentage of voters turning out was E section, with 97.44% of the eligibles casting their ballots. Closely grouped with only a difference of a percent, were L, K, and M units with 91.64%, 91.49%, and 91.26%, respectively. Other averages although smaller, may be attributed to the lack of competition in those sections. They are as follows: H-86.37%, G-68.06%, F-53.67%, C-47.62%, D-45.13%, and J-42.29%.
