FOURTEEN COUNCILMEN ELECTED; 5 UNITS TO REVOTE JUNE 11

Eleven Candidates Renew Political Campaign, Thurs.

ELECTION HELD HIGHLY SUCCESSFUL; CLOSE RACE EXPECTED IN REVOTE

As provided in the "Election Instructions," revotes will be held June 11, from 8 a. m. to 8 p. m. Run-offs will be held for the following who failed to win a simple majority. They are accorded 30 days to re-vote:

Fourteen councilmen out of the required twenty, representing two from ten units, were elected in yesterday's election was revealed last night.

Due to the lack of plurality, six councilmen from five units, namely B, G, K, L and M will hold another election on Thursday, June 11 to choose another officer for the hotly contested post.
