## 800 EXPECTED AT CENTER 13<sup>TH</sup>

ESTIMATED 850, FORMING THE FIRST OF THE MAIN BODY OF EVACUEES FROM SACRAMENTO WILL ARRIVE AT THE CENTER WEDNESDAY, MAY 13. SACRAMENTO WITH ITS J. PANESE POPULATION OF 3700 WILL BE ENTIRELY CLEARED BY SAT. MAY 16. WEDNESDAY EVACUEES WILL PROBABLY FILL BLOCK 3, and rest will be occupied accordingly. About 825 are expected on Thursday and about 1650 on Friday. On Sat. the remaining 400 will be inducted.

### MASS MEETING

Pleading for unity and cooperation, Dr. Iki, supt. of hospitals, asked for volunteer helpers to work in mess rooms and washrooms at the mass meeting Sunday at 3 p.m. May 16.

"Let us serve as examples to the incoming evacuees and show initiative", said Dr. Iki. "Let us not shirk from disagreeable task. Latrine must be cleaned and messroom must be attended to, bearing in mind that it is all for common good. Let us do things without being asked or assigned."

### FIRST MOTHER'S DAY

The first Mother's day in Walerga was highlighted by an inspiring Sunday morning sermon delivered by Dr. Henry Tyler, prof. of Bayliss, Sac'to J.C. Introduced by F. Kuono director of Japanese Christian Center, Dr. Tyler spoke before over 150 residents in the Walerga recving hall.

"The challenge is before you now," said Dr. Tyler. "By evacuating, you are entering the service of our country."

According to Dr. George Iki, superintendent of hospitals, all evacuees will be inoculated with typhoid injections and vaccinated with small pox serum. Wednesday evacuees will report to the hospital staff and Thursday evacuees on Friday.

To those of us who eagerly looked out of the crowded bus to our new homes in a large, the first sight of the long, grey buildings looming over the rolling grass horizon, aroused many thoughts in our mind.

For some of us the camp was symbolical of the final act of our evacuation: loss of job, business, home, and separation from friends, schoolmates and neighbors. But for a great many of us, the camp was the end of most of our current worries: the humiliation of obeying the curfew, the uncertainty of where to go, what to bring, and how to transport our belongings. True in camp we will be confined within the extent of its boundaries, but aside from that we are virtually free.

Any problems that arises must be solved among ourselves in the democratic way, the only way we know and want. The federal government has already voiced its confidence in our ability to maintain the same spirit. Dissension within ourselves is the first wedge driven into our morale.

It may seem unjust that we are confined in camps while they fight for freedom. But the kindly treatment we are receiving from fed. representatives; the vast preparation they have made to keep us occupied at the work we are most fitted for, certainly indicates that the govt. is doing its utmost to make our stay here in a large as comfortable as it is possible under the circumstance. We have the making of a wonderful camp; perhaps the best in the state. But it will depend on you, and me, all of us.

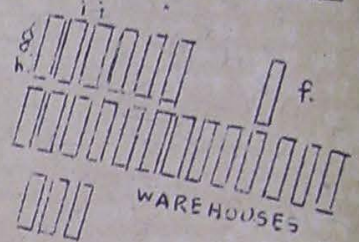

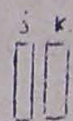
