"Let me again bring to the attention of the people of Heart Mountain that your response to the present registration will have an important bearing on your future. The eyes of the nation are upon you. Your loyalty to this country will be judged by your answers to questions 27 and 28 on forms 304A and 126 revised.

"All men 17 ears and older will be given the opportunity to complete their registration this week. Please do not fail to go to the designated registration place and fill out the registration forms."

Dillon S. Myer, WRA director in a telegrom today to Guy Robertson gave assurance that the WRA will defend citizenship rights of evacuees. The text follows:

"I have been informed that evacuees at several centers have asked for reassurance that citizenship rights of those evacuees born in the United States will be recognized. You are authorized to inform the evacuees at your center that the War Relocation Authority recognizes and will continue to defend those citizenship rights."

- 1. Candidates to be selected by a selection committee of at least five appointed at the block meeting. Blocks not having done this at their last meeting are to call a special session before the end of the week.
- 2. Candidacy to be open to both nisei and issei. Incumbents to be eligible for re-election.
- 3. Names of candidates to be posted on mess hall bulletin boards at least one day before election.
- 4. Voting by secret ballot; ballots to be cast at the regular Monday evening block meetings Mar. 1, 1943.
  - 5. Chairmanship of this particular meeting to be entrusted to block managers.

Hayashida's memorandum pointed out that since the inception of the Council, "residents have not been given any opportunity to express their confidence or non-confidence to the council members."
