The local Red Cross urged that contributions for the relief of flood disaster victims in the Pacific Northwest be taken or mailed directly to the Seattle-King County Red Cross headquarters, 905 Second Avenue Building, according to Lew V. Day, volunteer chapter chairman.

Although no quota has been set by the American National Red Cross and no special drive is being planned, the need is urgent, and all of the 3751 Red Cross chapters throughout the United States are accepting voluntary contributions which will be used solely for disaster relief in the stricken Northwest areas. Checks should be made payable to the American Red Cross.

Red Cross requests, however, that no clothing or food be included in the contributions.

"Aside from the need to comply with sanitary regulations and the difficulty of handling, sorting, transporting and storing donated food and clothing," Day explained, "Red Cross purchasing arrangements are such that it is much more economical and efficient for Red Cross to buy materials to meet specific needs. Red Cross can stretch the donor's money infinitely further through wholesale purchases than can the individual donor, and will apply the donations to the needs. rather than attempting to tailor the needs to the donations."

Commenting on contributions received at local Red Cross headquarters for flood relief from various organizations, Day said that the drive currently being conducted among its affiliates by the Washington State Federation of Labor had already resulted in a check for \$1,000, with more coming in, and the Seattle Rotary Club presented Red Cross with \$1,725, raised at the noon luncheon last week.

"Voluntary contributions from both individuals and organizations are coming in to our headquarters at a heart warming rate," Day said. "During the long months of recovery, Red Cross will use these contributions to supply medical aid, food and clothing, and give financial assistace in rehabilitation. Long after the present headlines are forgotten. Red Cross will continue to serve the flood disaster victims in the recovery program."

no appointment is required for your x-ray," said Mrs. Bouttee.

The Unit's visit, for the third consecutive year, is sponsored by the Jackson Street Community in cooperation with the Anti-Tuberculosis League of King County.

"No one can be sure he is free of tuberculosis until his chest x-rayed," Mrs. Boutte explained. Tuberculosis is treacherous because it is symptomless in its early stages-and it is communicable. That means that one person with unsuspected tuberculosis can unknowingly spread the disease among his family and friends. X-ray can find TB in these early stages, when the patient has the best chance for a omplete recovery."

The Unit is equipped to take minature x-rays which screen out healthy chests. If anyone's film shows suspicious shadows, he will be referred for a 14"x17" x-ray, and to his own physician for interprelation. Both x-rays are paid for by the sale of Christmas Seals, so here is no charge.

The parents and the next of kin witnessed the impressive burial rties which were held on the sloping field of Arlington Cemetery under a clear blue sky.

Although the remains that were committed to the soil of Virginia this afternoon were those of Nagato and Tanamachi, the funeral rites were conducted as well-in a symbolic manner—for the more than 650 young Nisei who perished in World War II. The Army's tribute to the Nisei dead was paid by General Devers who led a group of six Congressmen and Japanese American leaders in giving eulogies.

"There is one supreme, final test of loyalty to one's native land," General Devers said. "This test is readiness and willingness to fight for, and if need be to die for, one's country. Inese Americans, and their fellows, passed that test with colors flying. They proved their
