Shirakata and his Aloha Hawaiians are playing presently for the occupation personnel at the Sanno and Yaesu hotels. Once a week he goes over Radio Tokyo for a half hour of musical interlude.

The popular musician, who is the organizer and head of the Hawaiian Musicians Association, came to Japan on a visit around 1934 when Hawaiian music was the rage. A native of Hawaii and a master of stringed instruments, "Bucky" got together two other Hawaiian-born men to form a band.

Pointers On Painting Can Make Your Project Easier



If dry sunny weather tempts you to paint windows, screens, porch furniture or camping equipment like boats or docks, here are some painting pointers to make your job go more smoothly.

Your painting project can be an easier, faster, more satisfactory job, according to Betty Wood, decorating consultant for the Sherwin-Williams Company, if you:

Select the right paint. There's a paint for every purpose, and which kind you use depends upon what you want the paint to do, whether to be glossy for scrubability, flat for little light reflection, or to hide an undercoat, protect, decorate or seal. Let your paint dealer tell you about the newest kinds of paints developed for specific purposes.

Get the proper brush. Sure, you can slap on paint with any brush, but a really good job calls for the proper brush for an easier, smoother, faster application. Best size brushes include a three-to-four-inch for large surfaces, a two-inch for general surfaces, and an inch-and-a-half for fine detail and trim.

Make a fresh start. You spell doom to your decorating success if you paint any surface that is not free from dirt, dust, grease, rust, wax and paint flakes. A good quality paint remover, scraping, sanding or wire-brushing removes old "bubbly" paint. Then wash the surface clean with turpentine.

Pause before painting. You'll have fewer clean-up problems if you believe in an "ounce of prevention." Before painting, spread newspapers over flat surfaces that need protecting. If it's windows or trim you're painting, make a guard of stiff cardboard which you can press tightly against the surface to be painted, protecting the rest from splatters.

Another trick that professional painters find handy is to rub baby oil thoroughly into their hands. Put on before the painting project, baby oil foils the paint and makes the hand clean-up job no problem at all.

All primed to paint. Then, get started, remembering that two thin coats are better than one thick coat of paint. Note, too, that each coat should be allowed to dry thoroughly before the next one is applied. Otherwise, "alligatoring" may appear.

Deaf and Dumb, But Lad Masters Nine Languages

TOKYO — Nine foreign languages have been mastered by Masahisa Matsubara, 24, of Sendai, despite the fact that he was born deaf and dumb.

Matsubara first began to study English with a desire to correspond with Americans and his first correspondence was with Freddie Bartholomew, noted child actor.

Now, in addition to English, he has mastered French, Spanish, Italian, Swedish, German, Latin, Greek and Dutch. He writes to and receives letters from students of these countries.

His American pen pals are planning to raise funds to enroll him in a school in the United States.

TOKYO — Inspection of the American movie industry will be the aim of Masachi Nagata, president of the Daiel Film Co., who is leaving August 10 by plane for the United States.

JOINT WORSHIP WELL ATTENDED

Members of the congregations of five churches gathered last Sunday morning at the Japanese Methodist Church for united worship, the first union service of its kind held in the community. More than 200 attended the service.

The offering of the morning will be turned over to the "House for Hiroshima" project in which two close friends of the Nisei, the Rev. Emery Andrews and Floyd Schmoer, are parting. A total of \$94.94 was collected to support this project and comes at a time which is quite significant, the anniversary of the dropping of the bomb on August 6, just four years ago.

An interdenominational council may be formed in the near future, consisting of the Baptist, Congregational, Episcopal, Methodist, and Presbyterian Churches, to plan for periodic union activities.

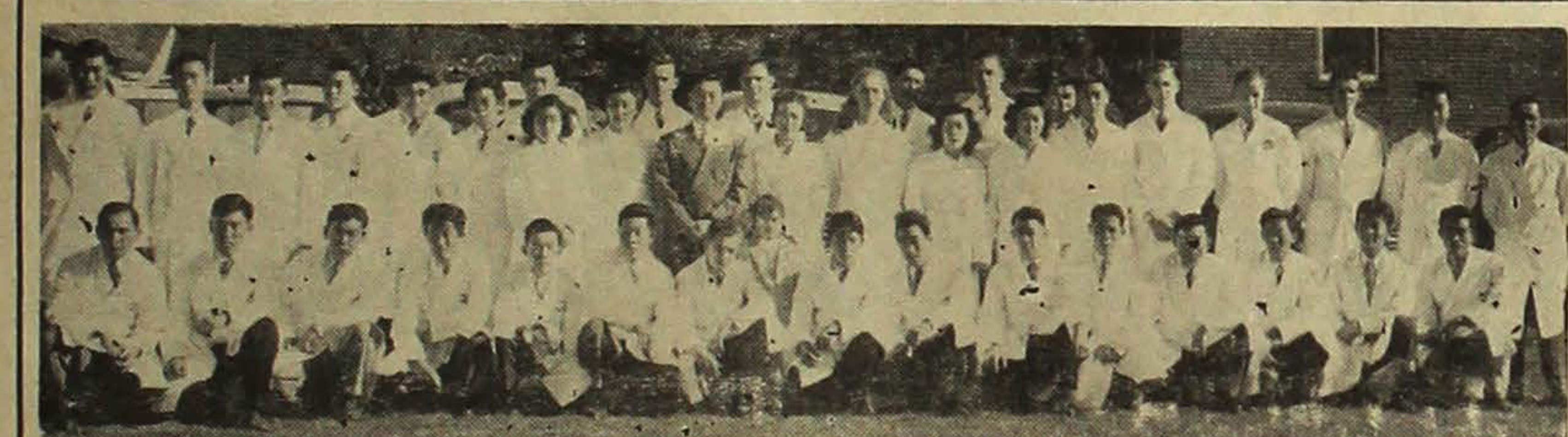

MANILA, P. I. — Susan Zimmerman of Portland, Oreg., and her eight California teammates, who were recently suspended as amateurs by the AAU for making unsanctioned exhibitions in Manila, will perform for American occupation troops in Tokyo on August 6 and 7. They may also compete against Japanese swimmers, according to Lou Bittner, Oakland sportsman who is promoting the Far East tour.

This will be the first time that American athletes will be admitted to Japan since the war.

Noguchi Designs Gliding Trophy

NEW YORK, N. Y. — There may be a wider acceptance of new concepts in trophy design as a result of the Lewin B. Barringer Memorial Trophy which was designed by Isamu Noguchi, distinguished sculptor.

The Barringer trophy was awarded recently at the National Soaring Contest at Elmira, N. Y., to the pilot who made the longest glider flight from any type of launching other than an airplane.

The Noguchi-designed trophy was described as a cast aluminum wing form with a 16-inch spread mounted on a solid ebony upright and fastened to a black anodized base with places for the names of the trophy and the winners.

Barringer, for whom the trophy was named, was an archaeologist and aviator and also a champion glider pilot. He was killed in 1943.

Record Climb

TOKYO, Aug. 3 — A former American track and cross-country runner established a new record for climbing Mt. Fuji when he scaled the 12,364-foot "holy mountain" of Japan in 2 hours 5 minutes last Friday.

The new record, which is 5 minutes faster than the previous record, was made by Lou Gregory, a Cornell University, Ithaca, N. Y., graduate who is now with the Yamanashi civil affairs team of the occupation forces, 70 miles south of Tokyo.

Nippon Press Set For Swim Meet

LOS ANGELES, Calif., Aug. 3 — With Japan's swimming team entered in the National AAU swimming championships to be held here from Aug. 16 to 19, a host of Japanese newspapermen is expected to cover the event.

Mikio Oda, 1928 Olympic hop-step-and-jump champion, who is now the sports editor of the Tokyo Asahi paper, and Shinkichi Iwanaga, of the Kyodo news agency, will be among the dozen or more Japanese newspapermen who will be here.

The Japan Broadcasting Company is planning to send two announcers for a direct short-wave broadcast from the Olympic swimming stadium to Tokyo, according to Yukio Ikeda, radio company official, now here as government witness in the Tokyo Rose trial.

Tsugio Iida, Japan's ace announcer of swimming events, is being contacted to broadcast the event.

15-YEAR-OLD HAWAII LASS BETTERS NATIONAL RECORDS

HONOLULU — Two national AAU swimming records were recently bettered by Evelyn Kawamoto, 15, one of the nine members of Coach Soichi Sakamoto's Hawaii swimming team.

In the time trials for the AAU outdoor championships to be held at San Antonio, Texas, Aug. 19 to 21, she did the 300-meter individual medley in 4:21.8 and the 200-meter breaststroke in 3:09.3.

The 36-hole event will also serve as the qualifying round for the club championship play-offs. The seven low gross scorers and Sumio Nagamatsu, who qualifies automatically as the defending champion, will then engage in match play for the 1949 club championship.

The eight low gross scorers in each of the other flights will also qualify for their own match play play-offs to determine the respective flight champions.

LOS ANGELES, Calif., Aug. 3 — Some 46,000 votes were tabulated in a single tally last Saturday night by the Nisei Week Queen Contest committee and the same girls are still in the coveted call of the "top seven".

Polling a record vote for a single tabulation is the current leader Margaret Kikuchi with her 10,180 Saturday for a grand seventh-round count of 33,243. Campaign managers have conceded that 30,000 would be required at the final day inventory to stay within the "top seven", a survey by the Festival Publicity staff reveals.

Statuesque Joan Ritchie renewed her fourth-spot honors mustering some 4,000 votes within three days. Yukie Sato and Fumi Iketani continue to hold down second and third places respectively for the third consecutive time.

LOS ANGELES, Calif., Aug. 3 — A wartime incident in which a well-known motion picture star played a real life-role as good Samaritan to a group of Nisei boys was recalled as his name was placed on the guest list of the Nisei Festival Coronation Ball to be held August 13 at the Riviera Country Club.

War had broken out and five Nisei sales clerks had been fired from their fruitstand jobs by a market owner in a "patriotic" gesture. Hearing the plight of the victims of unreasoned war hysteria, Ronald Reagan and his mother gathered the market owner's customers together and won them over to acceptance of the Nisei as Americans deserving of fair play.

The owner of the market who had fired the boys because "the customers will make it tough on me" saw it Reagan's way reinstated the Nisei. Said Reagan at the time, "Those boys are my friends."

LOS ANGELES, Calif., Aug. 3 — "Kachi-kachi" ondo routines are included in the gay Nisei Week Festival parade, according to the committee in charge. Known as "ondonettes" (two half-sections of bamboo slats), they made their appearance here in 1935 when the second Nisei Festival was held. Tri-weekly night practices have boosted Nisei Week spirit.

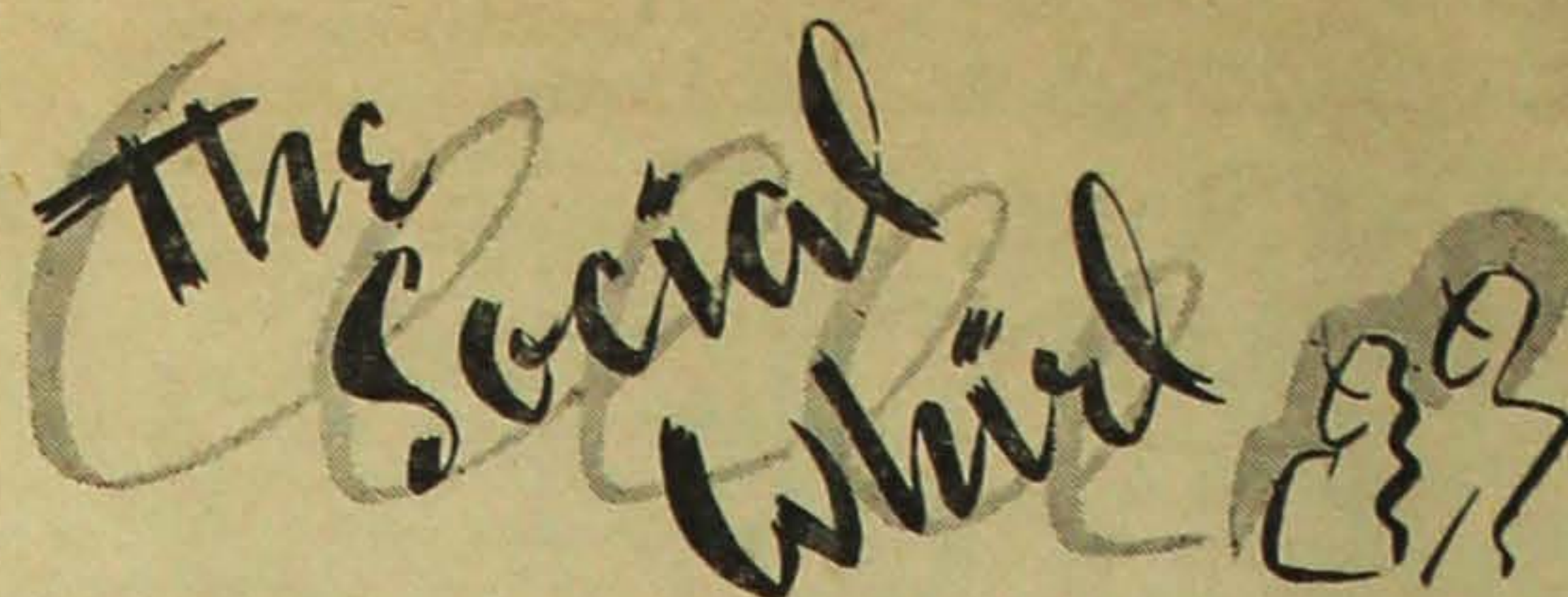
