

If dry sunny weather tempts | if you paint any surface that is not free from dirt, dust, grease, rust, wax and paint flakes. A good quality paint remover, scraping, sanding or wire-brushing removes old "bubbly" paint. Then wash the surface clean with

turpentine. Pause before painting. You'll have fewer clean-up problems if you believe in an "ounce of prevention." Before painting, spread newspapers over flat surfaces that need protecting. If it's windows or trim you're painting, make a guard of stiff cardboard which you can press tightly against the surface to be painted, protecting the rest from splatters.

Another trick that professional painters find handy is to rub baby oil thoroughly into their hands. Put on before the painting project, baby oil foils the paint and makes the hand clean-up job no problem at all.

All primed to paint. Then, get started, remembering that two thin coats are better than one thick coat of paint. Note, too, that each coat should be allowed to dry thoroughly before the next one is applied. Otherwise, "alligatoring"




