The New Soldier Brides Legislation

American applicant is able to provide.
How about proxy marriages? Immigration laws do not accept a proxy spouse as a legal spouse, and immigration laws govern the admission of GI brides.
Step children and adopted children? It is doubtful they will be considered admissible under the Soldier Brides Bill. Private laws will be necessary to bring them in.
Nor does the bill cover fiancées. They too will be admitted only by private law.

Now for the \$64 question. How does a serviceman or veteran get a bride or child into this country under the new law?
Action must be initiated by the American spouse.
In this country he must apply to the Immigration and Naturalization Service for Form I-133. This form will require the applicant to:

- 1) Establish his citizenship;
- 2) Prove his service status, and
- 3) Provide legal proof of marriage.

The service then will start action to grant the wife or children visas to enter the United States.
If an applicant is living in a foreign country, he may apply for a

NEW CURRENCY RULES ADOPTED IN JAPAN TOLD

Clarification of the recently adopted currency regulations in Japan is offered in a series of questions and answers, received by the local office of the Japanese Overseas Agency from the Japan Travel Bureau.

Q. What do you recommend as the best means for carrying travel fund in Japan?

A. Travelers' checks in U. S. dollars are the surest and the most convenient way to meet your needs as they can be exchanged into yen currency at the Japanese exchange banks and at the Japan Travel Bureau offices as well as at the foreign banks in principal cities. Travelers' checks in sterling, however, are not negotiable in Japan.

Q. What is the exchange rate and does it fluctuate?

A. A single and official rate is fixed at 360 yen for the U. S. dollar. Of course you cannot assume the exact equivalents at this rate, for nominal charge or commissions will be deducted by the cashing agents.

Q. Can I pay hotel and store bills with travelers' checks?

A. Sorry. You will have to get them exchanged into yen to effect all payments in Japan.

Q. Can visitors freely import foreign currency into Japan?

A. There is no limitation on your importing foreign currency, just like travelers' checks. The only inconvenience is that you will have to declare the amount in your possession at the Customs upon entering Japan. All subsequent banking transactions are to be entered on that slip which is to be surrendered on leaving Japan to enable re-export of unexpended amount permitted by the Customs. All such red tapes are not attached to travelers' checks.

Q. On leaving Japan what shall I do if I have the yen notes left?

A. The yen is not convertible into American currency. Neither can it be exported nor imported. Therefore you are cautioned to calculate your yen needs as closely as possible to avoid any inconvenience to yourself.

Q. What kinds of denomination are in circulation?

A. Of yen bank notes 1,000 yen is the biggest denomination followed by 100 yen and 10 yen. Both coins and notes are available for 5 and 1 yen.

WATCH NATORI
Ed Natori was suddenly shoved into the favorite's role for the 1950 PSGC open championship when Yone Nakao and Z. Shimoiishi, a couple who were called plain lucky just to have qualified for the match play playoffs, offered little respect for their highly-touted opponents—Sumio Nagamatsu, thrice champion, and Kuni Nakamura, Northwest open titleholder—and bounced them out decisively in the first round of play.
Natori, a finalist last year, served emphatic notice that he'll be the man to beat when he registered a 2-over-par 72 at Jefferson, including a back nine 32, in eliminating George Louie, the Chinese star. The latter, who shot a 76, was unfortunate enough to be pitted against Natori on one of his hot days.
The way it looks from this corner now Natori and Min Yamaguchi should proceed to the finals, for it would be expecting too much to have either Nakao or Shimoiishi continue their giant-killing roles, though plenty will be pulling for them.

The only definite thing that can be stated is that Nagamatsu's reign as club open champion, extending for three long years, is over and a new champion will be crowned about the second week in September.

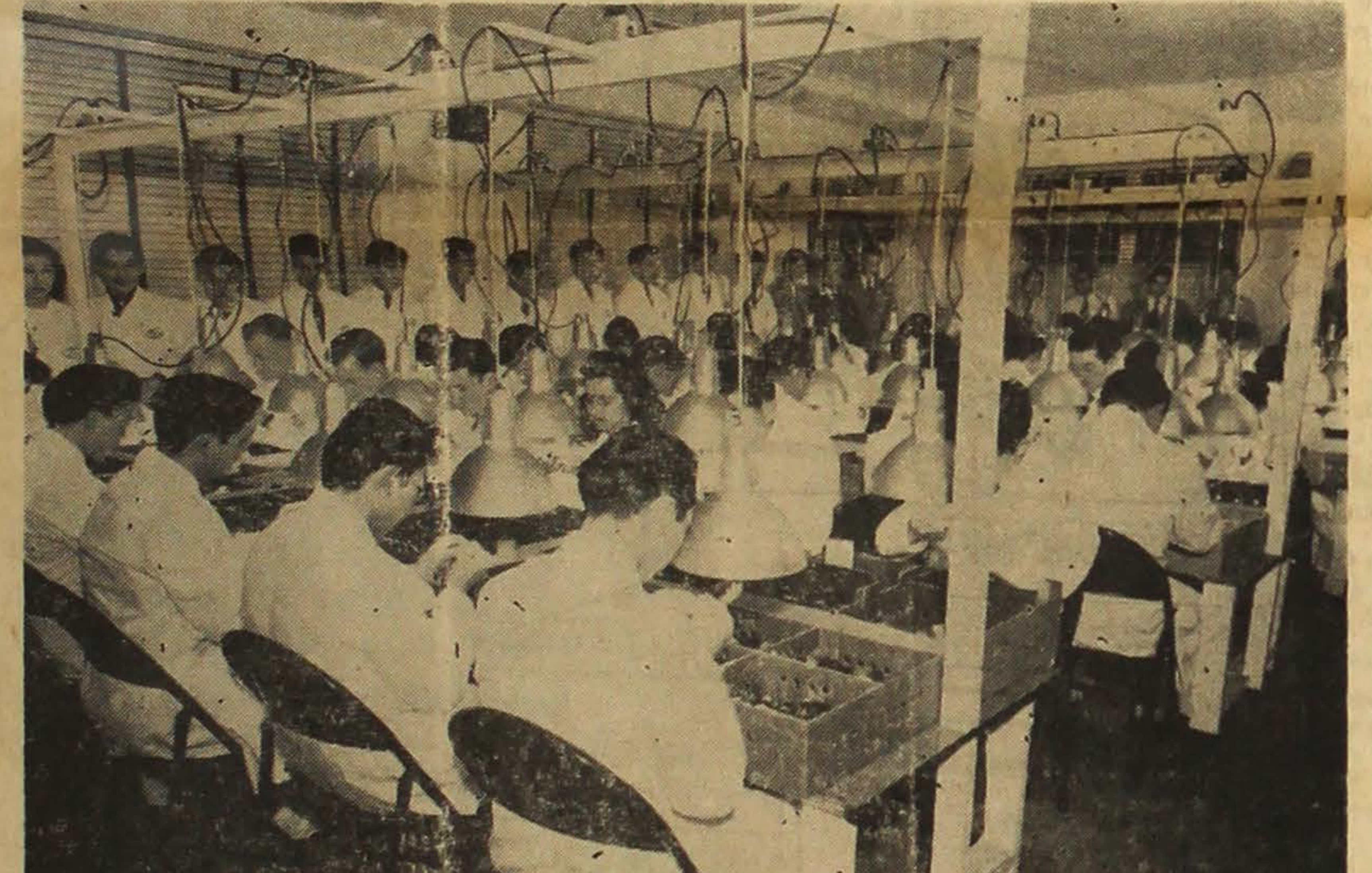

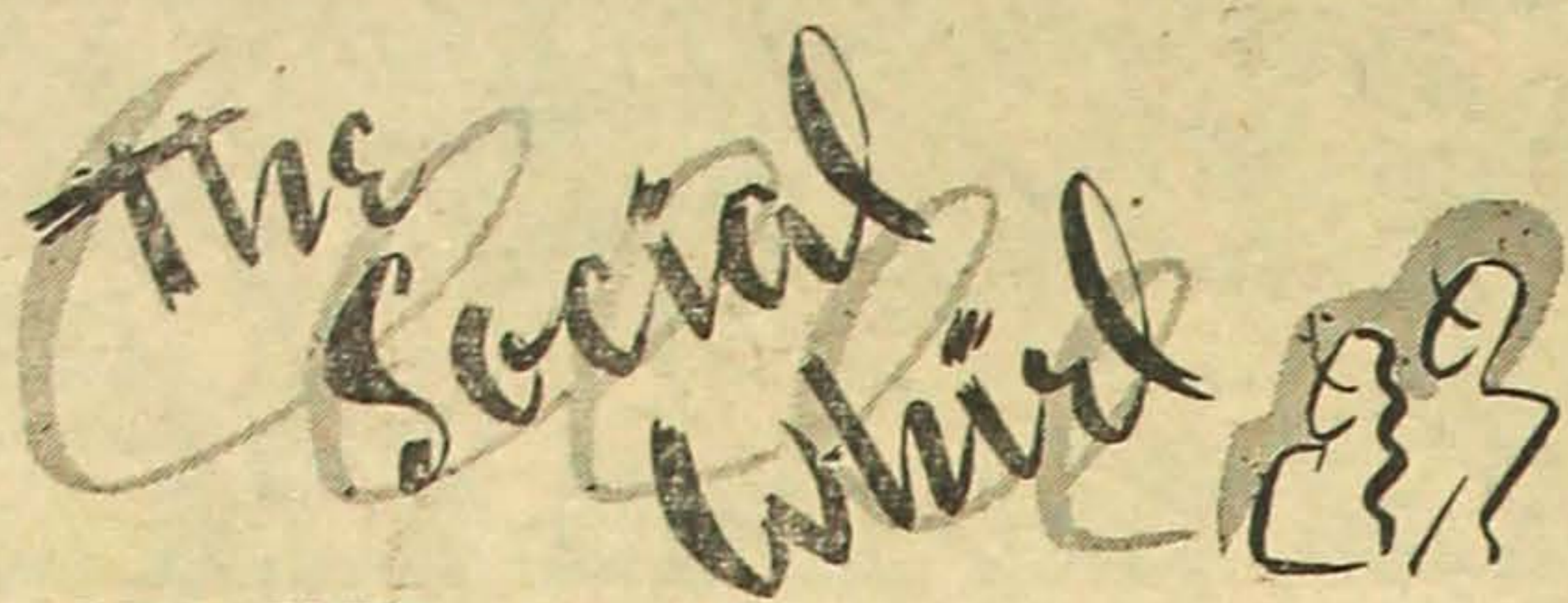

Congressmen Study Bills Affecting Orientals in a More Mature Air

(Continued from Page 1)
The House of Representatives, namely, to eliminate all racial barriers to naturalization but that in so doing we should incorporate in the bill certain procedural safeguards in order to assure, so far as possible, that disloyal persons would not be admitted to citizenship.

Without reading the compromise report, he asked "unanimous consent that a statement of the managers on the part of the Senate at the conference be printed" in the record. There was no objection.

Vice President Barkley said: "The question is on agreeing to the conference report." Not a senator objected. A significant bill had passed the upper House, although an hour later final action would be blocked by a technical request of Sen. Lucas to "reconsider" the vote so that he could have time to examine certain conference amendments to the resolution.

Shortly after the Senate first acted, Rep. Francis E. Walter (D., Pa.) asked unanimous consent in the House "for the immediate consideration of the conference report."

The speaker: "Is there objection to the request of the gentleman from Pennsylvania?" There was no objection.

Rep. Walter interrupted the clerk who had begun reading the report by asking "unanimous consent that the further reading be dispensed with." There was no objection. Rep. Walter moved the "previous question". The conference report was agreed to without objection.

In the few moments each House had spent in considering the measure, it was eminently clear the old voices were becoming dim and unpleasant memories.

The resolution still is not law. What is significant, though, in connection with it is not the technical holding it in the Senate, but the attitude of Congressmen towards persons of Oriental ancestry as exemplified by discussions on the measure.
