(Editor's note: Who can forget the relocation centers into which Japanese Americans and their parents were driven during World War II? Bob Okazaki, a former Seattleite whose sparkling short stories and feature articles were read up and down the Pacific Gunther is the author of the coast, probably wrote the best poem on camp life. Below is a reprint of Okazaki's "Good Bye, Poston!" Okazaki spent his early relocation days in the Poston, Ariz., center.)

A line or two, I write to you To bid you fond farewell; To let you know before I go How I've enjoyed this "Hell."






