But then the others came to the rescue to uphold Vet titular chances.

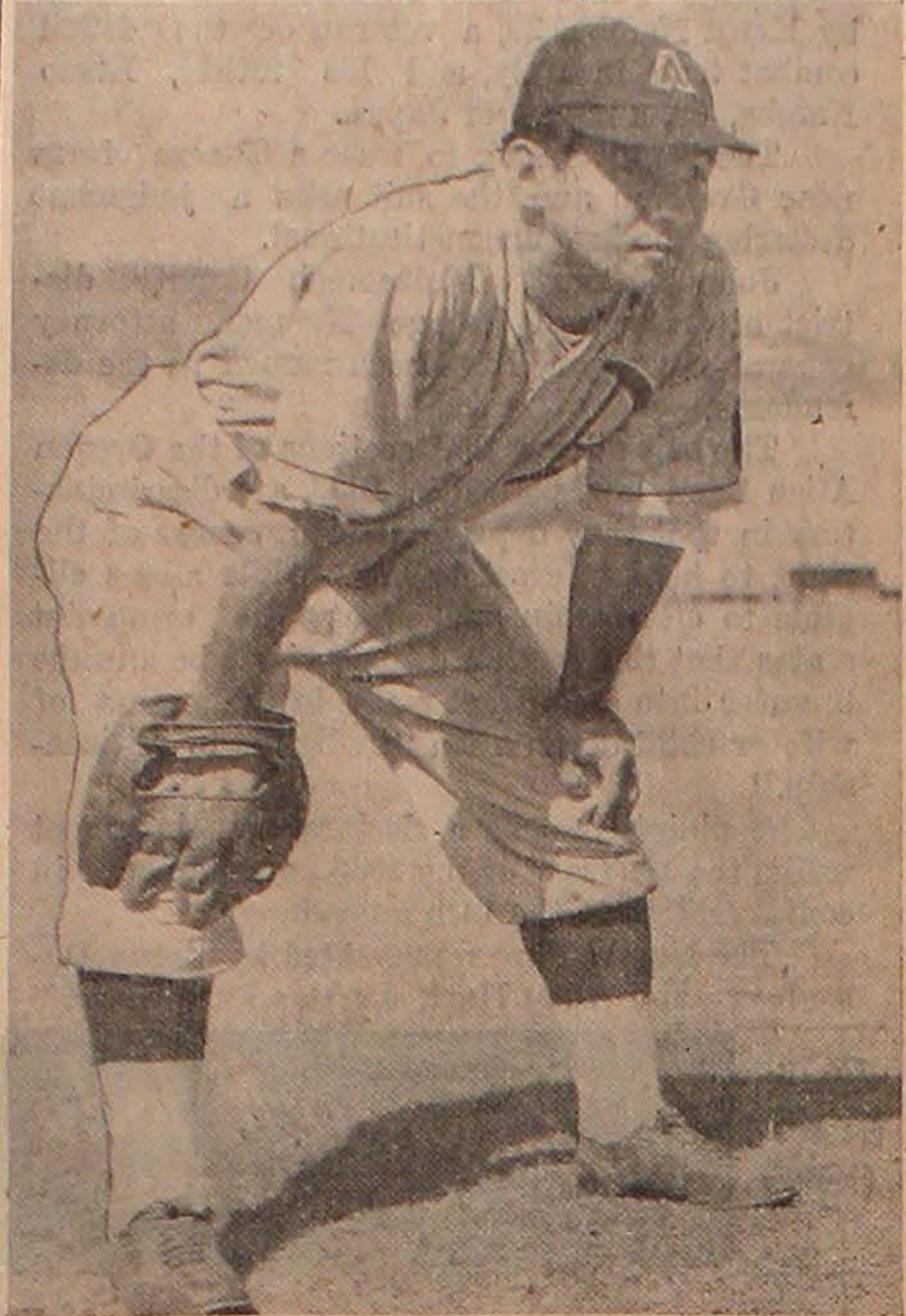

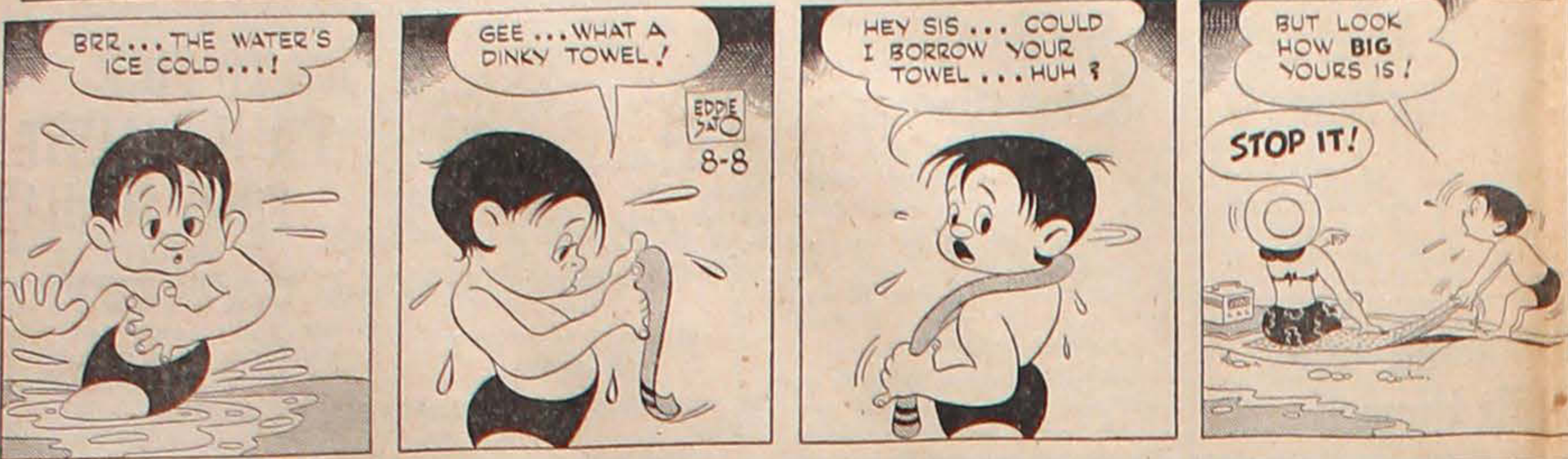

**Grateful Japanese Writes 'Arigato'  
To Americans for Relief Aid**

Miss Esther B. Rhoades, official representative of the Licensed Agencies for Relief in Asia (LARA), has received countless numbers of letters and poems from the Japanese people expressing their deep gratitude for the magnificent gifts, including clothes, milk, candies, and other vitally needed commodities which were sent from America.

The children at the Blind Children School in Yokohama sent in a book form a collection of their letters in Braille with many pictures to show their deep appreciation for the gifts received.

Miss Kichiko Saito wrote a poem in the Waka style expressing her joy in standing in front of a mirror to smile at her new American dress, while Shojiro Osawa offered his prayers before an altar displaying the American goods.

Miss Izumi Kimura, a student of Chofu Girls' High School, wrote as follows:

"My share was a pretty white dress and it became the best in my wardrobe. I am looking forward to wear it next Sunday. War sufferers and repatriates from foreign countries were given the priority in choosing whatever they liked and the rest were distributed by lottery. Some got nice warm coats, others pretty dresses, trousers, socks, etc. These things were especially precious to us for we have many repatriates and war sufferers who lost their entire properties in the war. Our country was at war with your country only a short time ago, so we never dreamed that we should receive gifts from you. The more we think about this the more grateful we feel toward you, although it is a poor way to express our feeling."

During the past months more than 10,000 garments were distributed among 229 girls schools, particularly for the needy in the six largest cities of Japan, according to Miss Rhoades.

"Approximately 30 different Japanese groups in America, Mexico and Brazil contributed for the LARA works," she said. "The San Francisco groups are the most regular and largest contributors among the many Japanese groups. The Japanese people in New York sent milk and clothes; from Denver, milk; from the Pacific Northwest, clothes; from southern California, milk; and from northern California, rice, flour, candies and soaps."

**Nisei Vet Fights Oregon Land Law**

PORTLAND, Oreg., Aug. 1—Initial test of the constitutionality of Oregon's Alien Land law, which prohibits aliens of Japanese ancestry from the ownership of agricultural property, will begin before Judge Crawford in Multnomah County circuit court on Tuesday, Aug. 5.

Judge Crawford will hear the suit filed by Kenji Namba, 22, a veteran of the 442nd combat team in Italy, and his father, Etsuo Namba, 59, a native of Japan.

The Nambas seek to lease a 62-acre farm near Gresham and the suit asks a judgment declaring the law unconstitutional.

John McCourt, Multnomah County district attorney, and George Neumer, attorney general of Oregon, have been named as the defendants.

The suit alleges that sections of the Oregon Alien Land law, passed in 1923, are discriminatory in that they deprive alien Japanese of the right to hold interest in land while aliens eligible to citizenship and that the complaint states that this section declares it to be a crime to enter into a contract made in the name of wife or child of an alien "ineligible to citizenship."

The plaintiffs asks a declaratory judgment ruling the 1923 law of the 1945 amendment in contravention to the 14th amendment.

The Nambas are represented by Verne Dusenberry and Allen Hart, Portland attorneys.

**Island Team Picked One of Favorites  
In National Semi-Pro Tournament**

WICHITA, Kan., Aug. 1—The All-Hawaii Stars, which has many of the top Nisei baseball stars of the Territory of Hawaii, are tabbed one of the favorites in the national semi-pro baseball tournament which is held annual in Wichita in August.

The team includes men of Hawaiian, Japanese, Chinese, Portuguese, Russian and Caucasian ancestry, according to Abe Saperstein, promoter of the Harlem Globe Trotters and the House of David teams, and MacKay Yanagisawa, Hawaiian promoter.

Among the stars of the team are three Nisei:  
Haruto (Lefty) Hirota, southpaw hurler and a hardhitter from Lihue, Kauai.

Kuroku Kanimoto, Maui batting champion in 1946 while playing

third base for the champion Hawaiian Commercial and Sugar nine. Fred (Cowboy) Hasegawa, a veteran of 14 years of baseball and a fast-ball pitcher who is used in right field when he is not pitching, Hasegawa is one of the best batters on the team.

The team also includes William Azevedo who played right field last year for the Salt Lake Bees in the Pioneer League.

Besides the games in the western states, an extensive barnstorming itinerary has been set up for the Hawaiian nine, including games in Chicago, Indianapolis, Kalamazoo, Mich., Muskegon, Mich., Flint Mich., Fort Wayne, Ind., Battle Creek, Mich., St. Joseph, Mo., Michigan City, Cincinnati, Charleston, Springfield, O., Lafayette, Ind., Bloomington, Ind., Quincy and Kirksville before the start of the national semi-pro tourney in Wichita on Aug. 19.

Other Nisei on the squad include Jimmy Wass, veteran second sacker, Jun Muramoto, Vernon Higa and Ichiro Mehara.

Percy Ching, Chinese American first baseman who has played pro ball in the New Mexico-Texas league, and Sol Kaulukukui are two other members of the squad.
