

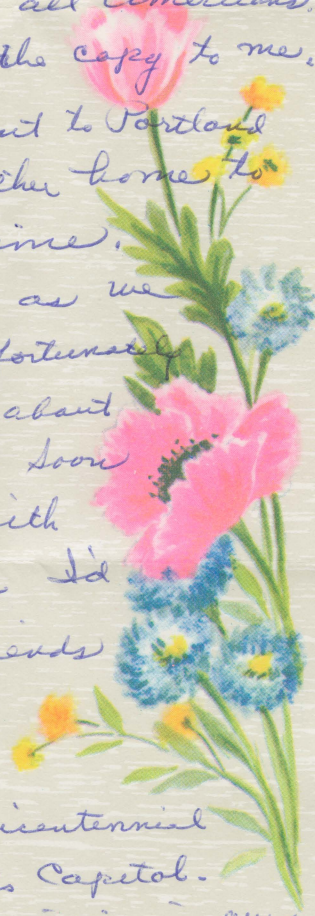

I read your story and was moved by your skillful presentation of those agonizing days. I like your generalization and the challenge to all Americans. Thank you for speeding the copy to me.

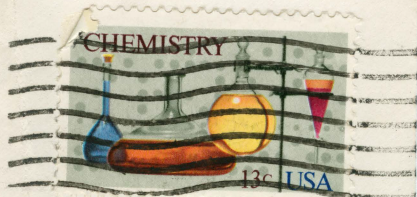
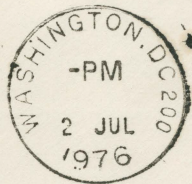
