How much bitterness & resentment still exists, what should the government done differently, did evacuees differentiate the execution of the policies by the WRA staffs from that of the Army?

Then there is Calvin Ninomiya of Chevy Chase Maryland. Would you like to write him or should I write him?

I will be attending the reunion in Seattle this summer only if invited.
