

SIXTY-THIRD MEETING
VALLEY CIVIC LEAGUE

November 6, 1937

This chapter has not paid the transportation and other dues to the N. W. board yet. A motion was made that we cancel our debts to the N. W. board amounting to \$15.00.

The motion was carried.

Tosh Yasutake reported that she was unable to secure a show yet.

Walter Tatsumi was asked to find ^{out} about any show in Seattle. He was to have appointed two people to aid him.

George Yasumura reported that we were \$22.00 behind in our subscriptions for the Pacific Citizen.




Walter suggested that we have various people connected with agriculture speak before us. The motion was carried.
