Charles C. Toshi started a discussion on the matter of dual citizenship. All were urged to get more information on this matter to be brought up at the next meeting.


Mr. Walter Tatsumi spoke to the club; his main point was that we should not have an inferiority complex, which is the greatest trouble of many graduates in securing positions.




A motion was made and seconded that we adjourn.
