Intramuros Case Next

At Yamashita Trial

ERROR

Yesterday your newspaper ran under the name KINCATIS today it has been rechristened KINKATIS so as to conform better with the combined names Kinkaid and ATIS

Manila: The war crimes trial of Gen. Tomoyasu Yamashita entered its second week on November 5th, with the prosecution revealing that it will next introduce the testimony bearing on the "Intramuros case", where during two weeks last

February the Japanese soldiers allegedly tortured and massacred more than four thousand non-combatants.

Major Robert Kerr, chief of the prosecution staff, rebutting the defense contentions that Yamashita was not the Supreme Japanese Commander in the Philippines and therefore should not be tried for crimes of men under his command declared, "It will probably take us two or more weeks to present our evidence, and that will be only a fraction of what we could offer. However, we merely want to show the broad pattern of cruelties to show that they were so widespread that the high command must have directed them."

The Prosecutor stated that last February the Japanese

WASHINGTON - The second raid on drug traffickers in Washington within twenty-four hours yielded one hundred twenty four suspects and thirty eight thousand dollars worth of drugs.

TYO - The Supreme Allied Headquarters Japan has taken over control of all Japanese financial dealings with foreign countries. From now on the Japanese government may issue a permit for persons to deal with foreign countries only after approval by the Allied Headquarters.

MOSCOW - Foreign Commissar Molotov rejected a request by British and American journalists that Russia abandon censorship of press dispatches to Great Britain and the United States.

HINA - The Communist Press has expressed fears of possible involvement of American troops in the hostilities with the Chinese government forces.

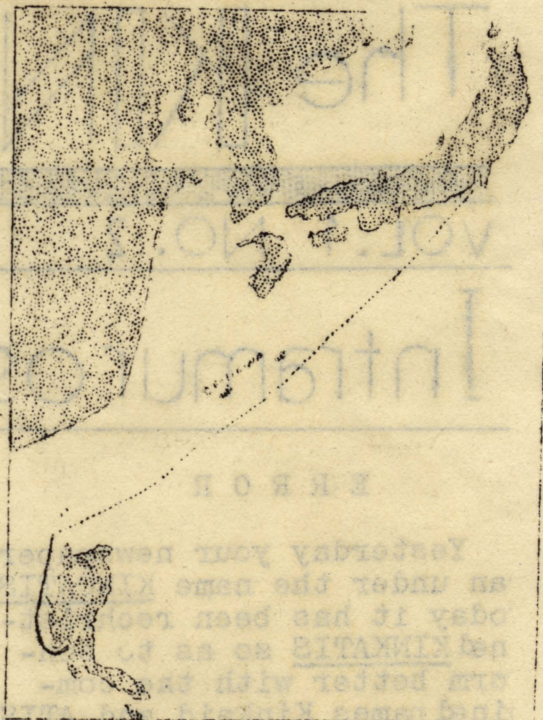
The Chaplain's Office is located at the starboard side of the boat house, aft.
