Italian Armistice Terms

Washington, London, and Rome released simultaneously today the Italian Armistice Terms.

The original terms of September 3, 1943, were entirely military, calling for cessation of all hostile action, transfer of the Italian fleet and aircraft, surrender of Corsica and all Italian territory, and free Allied use of ports, airfields, and other military facilities.

General Eisenhower, Supreme Allied Commander, wrote to Marshal Ba-

doglio, then head of the Italian government, that post-surrender developments had "already considerably altered the status of Italy which has, in effect, become a cooperator with the United Nations," and that the September 3rd military agreement might be "modified from time to time as military necessity or the extent of cooperation by the Italian government indicates this as desirable.

On September 23d, a memorandum on the employment of the Italian fleet and Merchant Marine against the Axis was signed by Admiral Cunningham, Allied Naval Commander in the Mediterranean and Admiral De Courten, marine Minister for Italy. The agreement provided that

CHINA - An Associated Press dispatch from Tientsin said unofficially that J.S. Marines probably would be withdrawn from North China by Dec. 5th.

PARIS - General De Gaulle resigned as provisional president of France, handing back control of the council to a constituent assembly for the first time in over five years.

GERMANY - The smokeless powder works at Kauf Bauren is the first of Germany's key war plants slated for destruction by the Allies Monday.

LONDON - An English jet-propelled plane set a new unofficial world's speed record of 605 miles per hour.

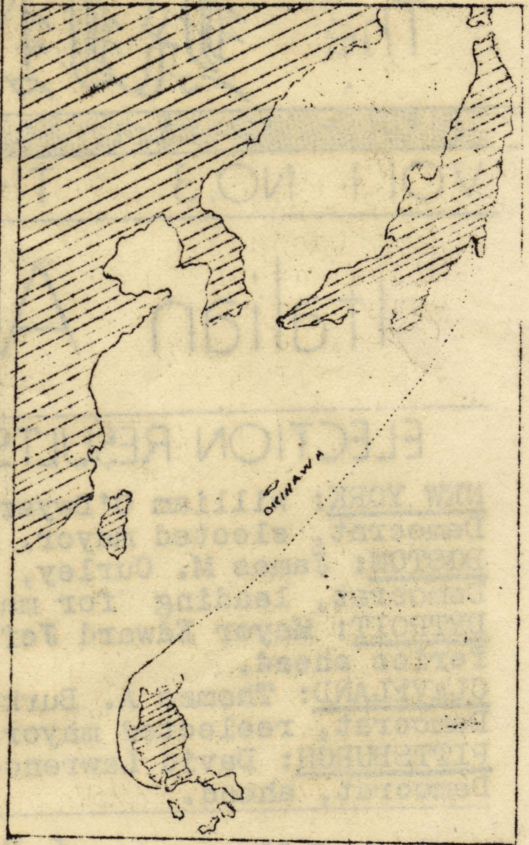
I've Heard that Song Before

ships able to be used actively in the Allied effort would be kept in commission for use under Allied orders and other ships would be placed on maintenance basis and disarmed. The Italian Merchant Marine was placed in the United Nations shipping pool to operate anywhere under the same conditions as the merchant ships of the Allied Nations. Additional conditions were added to the strictly military agreement of September 3rd on November 9th concerning "other conditions of a political, economic, and financial nature".
