MUST DEFER ALL NON-ESSENTIAL CONSTRUCTION

"The war has created a shortage of all materials required for all construction. For this reason, it is in the national interests that construction not directly or indirectly connected to the successful prosecution of the war be deferred for the duration of the emergency," states Paul G. Robertson, assistant project director.

According to Mr. Robertson, the War Production Board has issued Order L-41 to restrict non-essential construction. Construction as defined in Order L-41 includes putting up or altering any sort of a structure, including a building, road, bridge, dam, sewer

SLEATH ASSUMES DUTIES AS HEAD OF BASE HOSPITAL

Dr. Jack Sleath arrived at Tule Lake last Saturday to be the Principal Medical Officer here. He is the assistant to Dr. Carlyle Thompson, Principal Medical Officer of the War Relocation Authority.

Due to the fact that the population of this center

has been increased and the importance of the work of the medical staff here, it was felt that the best available man should be assigned to this center to have charge of the hospital and medical service for the people here.

Dr. Sleath has had wide experience in the work, in his position as assistant to the Principal Medical Officer of the War Relocation Authority and has an understanding of the problems of providing adequate and efficient service. Plans for Dr. Sleath to come herewere made recently when Dr. Thompson visited the Tule Lake Center.

SENTENCE NINE DRAFT EVADERS

A telegram from the Washington WRA states that nine draft age evacuees in the Colorado River Relocation Center who refused to submit to induction under the Selective Service Act have been sentenced to three year prison terms in the federal penitentiary.

DUPLICATE FORMS NEEDED FOR REPATRIATION-RECORDS

Persons who have applied for repatriation will be asked shortly by the Statistics Office, 1304, to fill out two copies of the repatriation form which they filled earlier. The reason it is necessary is that the Spanish Embassy now requires copies of the form.

The extra copies will be mailed directly to the individual applicant by the Statistics Office. It is requested that they be filled out and returned as soon as possible since the original application cannot be sent to Washington until the two additional copies are completed.

CROP PLANTING BEGINS ON FARM

Planting of onions, garlics and peas on the local farm will begin the latter part of this week, reports Howard Jarret, farm superintendent.

He revealed that a system of staggered planting will be followed for all fresh vegetables.

MESS PROBLEMS MUST FIRST GO TO COMMITTEE

The formation of a committee of eight ward representatives to take up problems and disputes pertaining to mess operation in each ward was revealed by Sage Muraoka, senior steward. The representatives will act as an intermediary body between the colonists and the mess management.

All problems must be approved by these representatives before being introduced to the senior steward or project steward. Full authority has been vested in the representatives.

ONLY PERSONS DENIED CLEARANCE MAY APPEAL

Persons to whom leave clearance has been denied by the Director, and they only, may file an appeal with the Board of Appeals for Leave Clearance. This Board of Appeals is made up of qualified persons, none of whom is otherwise an employee of the War Relocation Authority. The board will meet at the Tule Lake Center as occasion requires.

Hearings before the board will be informal but complete dockets will be prepared and full evidence will be received. Applicants will be permitted to hear evidence, to present evidence, to examine and cross-examine witnesses and to be represented by counsel if they wish. Interpreters will be used as needed.

The board may undertake independent investigations apart from the hearing itself if it wishes.

In each case the board will prepare its recommendation on the appeal, and this will be transmitted along with an accurate transcript and record of

PERSONNEL MESS FIRE CAUSED BY OVERHEATING

An overheated ventilator and pipe are believed to have caused the fire which broke out at the Personnel Mess, 3:13 a.m. Sunday morning, according to Arthur Kerr, acting fire protection officer.

First to arrive at the scene of the fire was engine #1 followed closely by engine #2. The fire was extinguished at 5:00 a.m.

Damage, estimated at \$3065 was confined to the kitchen.

"The Fire Department proved to be very efficient considering the amount of experience it has had," stated Mr. Kerr.

NOTICE BEING SENT THOSE OCCUPYING EXCESS ROOM

and similar jobs; it is also installation of equipment or fixtures.

"No construction may be started without approval from the WPB even though all materials are on hand or can be obtained without priority," he says, "It is therefore imperative that colonists refrain from making additions or alterations without approval of the Construction Department."

Violations of the Restrictive Order L-41 are punishable by fine and/or imprisonment.

Vacant apartments created by this move are to remain so for the use of the housing department which will be responsible for housing the 2,500 or more segregationees expected from other centers early this spring. Persons found to have moved into such vacated apartments without proper authorization will be compelled to move. The housing department requests the fullest cooperation of the center residents in the accomplishment of this consolidation.

BODINE HERE TRAFFIC REGULATIONS FOR STUDENT PROMULGATED BY POLICE RELOCATION

Thomas R. Bodine, field director of the National Japanese American Student Relocation Council in Philadelphia, arrived in the center last Thursday to interview students who are interested in continuing their education in eastern or mid-western colleges and universities.

The director will be at the high school from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. until Monday.

The council has helped 2500 students to relocate to 450 different colleges and universities.

EASTER EGG HUNT SUNDAY

A gala camp-wide Easter egg hunt for the kiddies will be sponsored by the Community Activities Section on Easter Sunday at 2 p.m. All those between the ages of 6 to 10 are eligible for participation.

P.A. GRANTS TO BE PAID SOON

Francis E. Bagley, head counselor of the Welfare Section, has announced that all applications for the February financial assistance grants have been processed and payments should be completed by the middle of this month. Applicants who have been found ineligible for assistance have already been notified.

All Federal, State, City and County traffic regulations have been in effect since Monday, announced Y. Takao, chief of Colonial Police.

The general speed limit within the project is 15 miles per hour and 10 miles

per hour in school zone. All truck and car drivers must give proper hand and arm signals before making turns or stops. Not more than three passengers are allowed in the front seat of any vehicle and passengers are prohibited from riding on tail gates, fenders, or on the cab.

Parking of vehicles within 20 feet of buildings is prohibited.

All vehicles are not permitted to cross the firebreak other than on center roads. No one is allowed to drive down alleys or between barracks except on deliveries or emergency calls.

In case of accident, drivers must immediately fill out WRA form 26, which will be found in each driver's compartment, and if possible, obtain names and addresses of witnesses.

Drivers violating these regulations will have their licenses suspended or revoked.

FIELD DAY SET FOR MAY 14

The annual community-wide Field Day under the auspices of the Community Activities Section is set for May 14.

A carnival atmosphere will prevail with many concessions and sports events being planned for the day. A talent show is also to be put on as one of the main features.

Residents may be enjoying more and more Japanese delicacies in the future if the request of Joe Bello, assistant steward, is answered. Colonists are asked to write in Japanese recipes to their respective mess halls where they will be sent to the steward's office. These recipes will provide valuable information on the type of food desired by center residents.

EX-POSTONIANS TO GET REBATES

Patronage dividends for the period from July 1 to Sept. 30, 1943, will be paid about April 15, according to word from Roy Tazawa, executive secretary of the Poston Co-op.

At the end of April Poston Co-op members at Tule Lake Center are to be completely paid up to June 30, 1943, as well as for the above-mentioned period.

FEDERATION ADOPTS NEW YP FELLOWSHIP COMPENSATION PROCEDURE TO FEATURE GUEST SPEAKER

It was decided at a recent reorganization meeting of Buddhist representatives that, in the future, compensation for wedding, funeral, and other such services will be made direct to the Buddhist federation or to ward headquarters and not to individual ministers. The federation is to be responsible for the remuneration of ministers.

A resolution signed by 12 reverends states, "In accordance with the reorganization of the Buddhist Federation, we hereby resolve to accept no compensation whatsoever for Buddhist services rendered."

Temporary headquarters of the Buddhist Federation will be at 1108 in Ward 4.
