TULE PAROLEES TO BE GRANTED HEARINGS SOON

Aliens who previously have been interned in Department of Justice internment camps and who are at present in Tule Lake Center subject to special "segregation" or parole orders, who do not desire repatriation, shortly will be granted hearings here, at which they may show cause why they should not be removed to Japan, the Department of Justice announced today.

A special hearing board will come to Tule Lake to hear these cases. This board and these hearings have no connection with and should not be confused with hearings which are being arranged for renunciants, the Department of Justice said.

WRA FACILITIES STILL AVAILABLE

All facilities of WRA continue to be available at Relocation Headquarters to all persons who have not completed resettlement plans, W. K. Holland, relocation program officer, pointed out today.

"Everyone at present eligible to relocate has recorded at least a tentative relocation plan, and such plans are being developed to completion rapidly to meet the requirements of resettlers in the best possible manner," Holland said. "All facilities at Relocation Headquarters are being maintained for this purpose."

At the same time R. R. Best, project director, gave assurance that any persons not at present eligible to relocate but who may become so before it is necessary for WRA to close its services to evacuees at Tule Lake Center, will be given as far as possible the same consideration as persons who were in a position to do their planning

JUSTICE DEPT.

RENUNCIANTS MAY NOW APPLY FOR HEARINGS

Application forms for the use of all renunciants of United States citizenship who do not desire to go to Japan now are available in each Block Manager's Office.

These forms are the means by which renunciants who seek permission to relocate in the United States may make application for hearings which will be held in Tule Lake Center shortly after the first of the year, announced Charles Rothstein, representative of the Department of Justice.

3550 VOLUNTARY REPATRIATES EN ROUTE TO JAPAN

Christmas Day and yesterday approximately 3550 voluntary repatriates, including family groups, left Tule Lake Center in four special trains to board a ship scheduled to sail today from Portland for Japan. The ship's passenger list includes also repatriates from Santa Fe, Bismarck and Crystal City.

This was the second repatriation movement involving Tule Lake residents. The first group, 423 single men, left the center Nov. 23. Both movements have been under the jurisdiction and authority of the Immigration and Naturalization Service, Department of Justice. American-born children accompanying alien parents to Japan will retain their United States citizenship and later may return to this country if they choose.

"The Director has given assurance," said Best, "that if, as the result of Department of Justice hearings soon to be held here, any persons now under Department of Justice detention should be granted permission to remain in the United States, they will be given every possible WRA assistance as long as that assistance is available. This will be dependent entirely, of course, on the Department of Justice decision in each individual case."

Each renunciant who does not wish to go to Japan should visit his Block Manager's office at once, fill out and sign a form, and leave it with the Block Manager, Rothstein said. The completed application forms will be collected from all the Block Managers' offices by Zenshiro Okubo, central block manager, who will be responsible for their delivery to the Department of Justice.

Before the hearings begin, a master list of applicants will be posted in each Block Manager's Office and in Central Block Managers Headquarters for each individual to check personally to determine that his name has been recorded properly, and to guard against any names being omitted.

It is essential, Rothstein said, that all applicants for hearings place the completed forms in the hands of their Block Managers by noon of Monday, Dec. 31.

Applicants will be notified later of the time they are to appear for their individual hearings.

The forms are simple.

NEED FOR MORE WORKERS ANNOUNCED BY PLACEMENT

John Matsumoto, Placement officer, today issued an urgent appeal for more workers "to help maintain the usual standards of the center".

Said he, "There are many jobs open in the Placement Office which must be filled in order to give the proper service to evacuees of Tule Lake Center. The co-operation of everyone is requested and you are asked

to make application immediately to relieve workers now employed by various sections.

"Many of the pipe lines have been frozen, which make it impossible for everyone to be served as they would like to be served, and proper service cannot be maintained due to shortage of help in the Maintenance Section.

"Also, the Property Control Section needs help in unloading coal and delivering it to the colony residents so they may keep their barracks warm.

"Won't you please do your part and offer your services at once to maintain the usual standards of the center?"

TULEAN ENDS LIFE IN KLAMATH FALLS

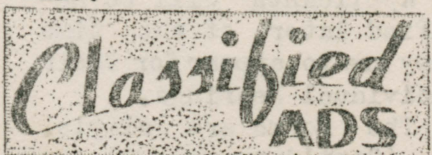
The body of Sosuke Ioka, 65 years old, former resident of 402-B, was found last Friday under the bleachers at Klamath Union High School's athletic field in Klamath Falls. A rope had been looped around a girder and around his neck. Klamath Falls authorities said Ioka apparently had taken his own life.

Ioka left Tule Lake Center the afternoon of Dec. 14, en route to Lodi, Calif., where a farm job was awaiting him. The Klamath County coroner said he had been dead several days when the body was found by a high school student.

Before evacuation Ioka lived at Clarksburg, Calif. He was a native of Hirao-son, Yamaguchi-ken, Japan, and had no relatives here.

WRA TO CLOSE FIELD OFFICES WITHIN 5 MOS

The War Relocation Authority will close its field offices in six eastern cities during the five months beginning Jan. 1, it was announced this week in New York City by Robert Dolins, relocation supervisor for the East Coast Area.

Ceasing operation on New Year's Day, the Newark, N. J. district office at 20 Washington Place will be the first to close. The other offices will close on the following tentative schedule:

Boston, Mass., 1702 Post Office Building; and Hartford, Conn., 804 American Industrial Building---Feb. 1.

Washington, D. C. (district office only), 1006 U Street NW; New York City district office, 6301 Empire State Building; and Philadelphia, Pa., 1105 Stephen Girard Building---Apr. 1.

New York City East Coast Area Office, 5301 Empire State Building---June 1.

"After each office closes, a community committee and local agencies which have in the past cooperated with WRA in the Japanese American resettlement program will continue working together to provide services essential to the successful adjustment of evacuees who have resettled in each district city and vicinity," Dolins said. "These newcomers thus will continue to have available the community resources which each community customarily provides for persons needing assistance in meeting problems related to employment, housing, health, and integration in normal community life."

They state:

"I do not wish to return to Japan. I request that I be given a hearing and the opportunity to show cause why I should not be removed to Japan."

The forms contain spaces for the applicant to print name, birthplace, birthdate and present address in the center, and a space for the signature. No other information should be placed on them.

EXPRESS AGENT ISSUES CAUTION

As a precaution against possible shipping mix-up, residents are requested by Mrs. A. M. Bond, Southern Pacific Express representative, to write addresses of the consignee and the sender inside all packages and trunks and to write the return address on the outside of goods to be sent.

"Drivers of trucks other than the regular express carrier are asked not to leave packages for shipment on the loading platform, because it only adds to confusion and delay," reported the Southern Pacific agent.

CONSOLIDATE ALL WELFARE OFFICES

All offices of the Welfare Section are being consolidated today in Wing #5 of the high school, the building which is occupied in part by the Leave Office.
