

# RESIDENTS PAY SOLEMN TRIBUTE AT FINAL RITES FOR OKAMOTO OUTDOOR FUNERAL ATTENDED BY 9000

Nine thousand people stood bareheaded for hours in a chill wind and a drizzle of rain Wednesday afternoon to pay lasting tribute to the memory of Shoichi James Okamoto, martyred victim of a shooting which Secretary of Interior Harold L. Ickes termed "completely unwarranted and without provocation on the part of the victim."

Thousands came from all parts of the center, in spite of the cold discomfort, to stand with bowed heads in tribute to the deceased. At the same time they were expressing a protest against the hate and intolerance engendered by this war. Men and women, young and old, mothers with babies in their arms, thus offered sympathy to the bereaved family. Every person present was moved by sorrow.

### FURTHER GROUP MOVEMENTS TO TULE LAKE DISCONTINUED

Scheduled group movements of the segregation program which were contemplated for Tule Lake were completed with the arrival of 90 segregants from Gila and 14 from Topaz centers over the week-end, revealed Harry L. Black, assistant project director. The contingents which arrived here have filled up the housing capacity, and the center is unable to accommodate any more group movements.

He disclosed that there still remains in other centers a large number of

evacuees eligible for transfer to Tule Lake because of leave clearance denials, repatriation or expatriation applications; but there is no intention of transferring them until housing facilities are available. The Housing Unit has been busy making adjustments but due to the shortage, a policy has been established whereby the only additional people allowed to come here will be those who have families who have room for them or those who have been detained in other centers because of illness or for other reasons.

#### RUMOR

The assistant project director said that there were no foundations to the rumor that they are going to build additional blocks in this center. Present facilities are inadequate to permit further building of blocks, he explained.

Mr. Asamitsu Okutake was the chairman for the service. Mr. Iwao Namekawa gave a graphic testimonial on the history of the late Shoichi Okamoto, an account of the making a true Japanese who had had the best of life still before him. Words of condolence on behalf of the center residents was given by Mr. Kazumi Kawacka.

In deep silence broken by the wind, the Rev. Senzo Sasaki conducted the final rites assisted by all other Buddhist reverends in the center. Incense offerings were made by various organizations, departments, and ward representatives.

#### MESSAGE

Project Director Ray R. Best extended a memorial address in behalf of the Administration. He said, "I wish to express regret that this unhappy event has occurred. I have already assured the young man's family on behalf of the Administration that all in our power will be done to assist them in their hour

### SPACE REQUIRED UNDER BARRACKS SAYS ROBERTSON

"It is essential that the space underneath each barrack be opened to fresh air", states Paul G. Robertson, assistant project director.

According to Mr. Robertson, "Most of the residents in Tule Lake Center have sealed off this space by placing dirt around the edge of the barracks in order to keep them warm during the winter months. This condition existing for too long a time may cause dry rot. With the warm weather fast approaching, the necessity for keeping the spaces sealed no longer exists.

The construction of these barracks is such that the air spaces should be made at the ends of the barracks rather than at the sides. However, it

### COLONIAL POLICE TENDER PLAN TO SELECT COMMISSIONER

In keeping with the recent WRA policy of permitting residents of the center to engage wherever possible in a form of self-government, a plan to select new police commissioners was presented today by the Colonial Police to Civic Organization whereby the people in each block are to hold meetings in the near future and elect candidates for police commissioner.

Mr. Best, Mr. Black, and Mr. Holding will then interview three men in each

ward and select one person to act as police commissioner from each ward.

Duties will consist in advising the Colonial Police in matters relating to rules and regulations and personal conduct within the colony.

Block managers will forward details of the election within the next few days and residents are asked to give careful consideration to their selections as the commissioners should be men of good judgement and fairness.

**DENTAL****DISPENSARY CLINIC TO OPEN DAILY BEGINNING MONDAY**

Commencing Monday, the hospital has arranged a new schedule for handling dental cases in the colony.

The colony dispensary dental clinic will be open daily Monday through Friday from 8:30 to 11:30 a.m. and from 1:30 to 4:30 p.m. It will also be open on Saturdays from 8:30 to 11:30 a.m. All people needing dental care during the week should apply at the colony clinic between the hours outlined above.

All appointments for dental service will be made through the colony dispensary and no persons will be attended at the hospital dental clinic until they have first been seen at the colony dispensary.

Whenever the colony dispensary is closed, people in need of emergency dental treatment should apply to their block manager, who will make all necessary arrangements.

Residents are reminded that the number of dentists at this center is very small and cannot possibly do immediately all the dental work that needs to be done. As far as possible, the dental department will determine the need of each patient and give him an appointment on the basis

**JAIL AT 1808 FOR DRUNKS, MALFEASANCE**

A jail has been established at 1808 to take care of future cases of drunkenness and disorderly conduct, according to the Colonial Police.

Chief Shimokon announced that first occupants are Eddie Okada, 1813-C, and Torakichi Nishida, 504-D, under 30-day sentences for drunkenness and disorderly conduct. They have been assigned to special work, picking up paper scraps, cleaning up the police station, and other miscellaneous jobs.

Meals are eaten at the 1820 mess hall under officer escort, and lockup time is 7 p.m.

**PIN BADGES; SHOW PASSES**

On Sunday morning, a new post was established near gate #3 by Colonial Police to assist workers leaving the colony in having their badges in the proper location and having blue passes in plain sight so they can be quickly checked by the military police as they pass through the gate.

Chief Shimokon stated that all workers have now been advised to pin their work badges on their outer clothing halfway between belt and shoulder. It is believed that this work in checking people before they reach the military police will eliminate future misunderstanding.

**MAN SENTENCED TO KLAATH JAIL ON BATTERY CASE**

Kaoru Nagatani, 50-year old center resident living in 3419-D, was attacked and beaten at his residence Friday evening. He was removed to the base hospital where it was revealed that he had suffered from fracture of bones, but his condition was reported not critical.

Tatsuo Yokoyama, 2606-C, was placed under arrest by the Colonial Police charged with assault and tried before Project Director Ray R. Best. He was found guilty and sentenced to 90 days in the Klamath Falls jail.


