WRA ASSUMES ALL FUNERAL PHOTO EXPENSES

Arrangements have been made whereby all funeral photographs will be taken at WRA expense, it was reported at the block managers' meeting Wednesday. The WRA will furnish a negative and two prints free of charge to the family concerned.

Residents are notified that August 23 is the deadline for filing shoe stamp applications. Stamps now in possession or received before November, 1944 may be used until that date.

In regard to dental surgery appointments, the Block Managers Headquarters commented that contact was made with the Hospital Koenkai and an effective appointment service is expected shortly.

PROCEDURE ON SHIPMENT OF OKOTSU TO JAPAN RECEIVED

Information from the State Department concerning shipment of human ashes to Japan on future exchange ship has been received by the American Red Cross.

The information revealed that there is no restriction upon the exportation of ashes of deceased persons from the United States. However, as custom inspection of baggage or property of enemy aliens is necessary upon their departure from the United States, the ashes should be placed in a container which is packed in such a way that it may be readily opened for inspection by the United States custom officials.

There are no means now available for forwarding ashes to Japan, but in the event there are future exchanges of American and Japanese nationals, it is expected that it will be possible to forward such ashes on the exchange vessel.

CO-OP AUDIT COMPLETED FOR FISCAL YEAR; FINANCIAL CONDITION SATISFACTORY

Auditing of accounts of the Tule Lake Cooperative Enterprises was completed last week for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1944, according to G. C. Hofacre, public accountant and auditor. Hofacre and his assistant, E. M. Greer, arrived from Walla Walla, Washington July 29 to audit the accounts of the Tule Lake Co-op. They departed for Gila River August 9.

"The operations are favorable here when compared with other centers," Hofacre said. "The financial condition of the Tule Lake Co-op as of June 30 shows a ratio of current assets to current liabilities of 3.38 to 1."

George Matsumura, Co-op treasurer, added that a detailed financial statement of the examination will appear in the Cooperator, as soon as it is received.

PEACE OFFICE EMPHASIZES NEED FOR FULL BLOCK REPRESENTATION

A more effective enforcement of the new patrol system to maintain peace and order in the center may be assured if blocks are fully represented, declared the Colonial Peace Office today, as blocks without patrolmen were requested to select representatives.

The Colonial Peace Office explained that the employment policy currently in effect does not apply to patrolmen, and families with a maximum number of workers are also qualified for this position. At the same time, the office issued the following memorandum:

HOSPITAL WAGES CEASELESS WAR ON MOSQUITOES

War against mosquitoes is being waged without letup by the Hospital Sanitation Unit. All pools of stagnant water, not only within the center, but around the outside and even on the farm area have been treated with repellent oil and chemicals to prevent hatching of larvae.

Sacks containing sawdust saturated with chemicals have been submerged in the "J" Canal so that the chemicals, flowing downstream, prevent breeding of mosquitoes anywhere in the environs of the center.

Laboratory examinations of more than one hundred local mosquitoes to determine whether or not they might be disease carriers disclosed that none of the specimens were of the disease transmitting variety.

KOENKAI ANNOUNCES CABINET; APPOINT CURRIE AS PERMANENT CO-OP DIRECTOR

BLOOD-DONOR DRIVE RESULTS

The Hospital Koenkai, which has been acting as a medium of contact with the evacuee hospital staff toward improvement of hospital facilities for benefit of the residents, announced the result of their meeting held at 1608 last week.

Selection of the following officers was announced by the organization: Taisei Naito, executive secretary (salaried); Kazue Miyata, secretary (salaried); Masaru Osaki and Shinjiro Nakamura, treasurers. A resolution to present letters of appreciation to individuals

for special services rendered was also adopted.

The koenkai disclosed that a recent blood-donor drive received enthusiastic response from the residents. Twenty-eight donors responded from Block 28, it was reported.

ATTEMPT TO OUST PATIENTS FAILS

LOS ANGELES---Federal authorities have been unsuccessful trying to remove Japanese American citizens from the Los Angeles sanitariums for tubercular patients, it was reported in the Daily News. Request was made by County Superintendent of Charities A. J. Will in order to make more room for other citizens who are eligible for pulmonary treatment.

Abe Fortas, undersecretary of the Department of Interior, stated that no federal facilities were available although "thought has been given to the possibility of placing Japanese tubercular cases in Indian Service institutions, but the admission rate is gradually rising and they're almost filled to capacity."

Appointment of Ralph Currie, who has been acting as temporary head of the Tule Lake Cooperative Enterprises the past month, to the position of permanent supervisor was announced today by Harry Black, assistant project director in charge of Community Management.

Lee Poole, supervisor of Manzanar, who was expected to arrive here this month has transferred to a new post with the United Nations Relief and Rehabilitation Administration, he stated.

"The new supervisor is well qualified for the position," Black said. "Prior to his post here, he was supervisor of business enterprises at both the Gila and Poston centers."

Sheldon Lowery, Evacuee Property officer, said Monday that a carload of evacuee property belonging to former residents of Sacramento was expected to arrive here within a few days.

SHELTER CAMP READY FOR EUROPEAN REFUGEES—WRA

Preparations have been completed by the WRA on the War Refugee Shelter Camp at Fort Ontario in Oswego, New York for receiving the group of nearly 1000 European refugees who have been brought to the United States in accordance with the plan announced by President Roosevelt on June 9, announced Harold Ickes, Secretary of Interior.

The WRA, which was made responsible by the President for administering the shelter camp, took over custody of the grounds at the Fort from the Army July 28. It was reported that a staff of 40 WRA employees is stationed there making final arrangements for the refugees' arrival. (Among the staff is Allan Markley, former Tule Lake Center reports officer, who is in charge of public relations there.--Editor's Note)

The refugees, ranging in age from four weeks to 70 years, arrived last week at New York and were to entrain soon for Oswego.

THREE MANZANAR WAREHOUSES BURN

Three warehouses were destroyed by a fire at the Manzanar Relocation Center Friday night, July 28, reported the Manzanar Free Press.

The center fire department succeeded in putting the fire under control within 20 minutes. Two evacuee firemen were injured, both receiving first degree burns. An investigation as to the fire's origin and the extent of property damages is being conducted, it was stated.
