FURTHER ACTION ON TULE DRAFT CASE DROPPED

SAN FRANCISCO---Twenty-seven Tule Lake Japanese whose indictments on draft dodging charges were dismissed by Federal Judge Goodman of San Francisco, sitting in Eureka a month ago, will not be prosecuted by the government.

This was disclosed Saturday by Frank Hennessy, United States attorney, who said he had received instructions from Washington not to appeal the case, reported the San Francisco Chronicle.

RELEASE NEW EMPLOYMENT RULING FOR KEY WORKERS

Harry Black, acting project director, announced this week that an opportunity will be given to families where three or more evacuees are employed, one of whom is a key worker, to decide which of the two, other than the key worker, shall terminate.

However, Black said, "If neither of the other two terminates, the personnel officer will terminate one of the two, the key worker remaining on the job. Should the key worker refuse employment, then the entire family will be terminated.

"In the case of both members of a family of two being employed, the key worker will remain on the job and the other member must terminate. Should the key worker refuse employment, both members of the

TWO NISEI CAN RETURN TO COAST

LOS ANGELES--U. S. Attorney C. H. Carr stated on August 24 that the Western Defense Command had exempted two nisei, Shizuko Shiramizu and Masaru Baba, from the exclusion order for Japanese from the west coast. They were two of three nisei who had filed injunction suits, through Civil Liberties Union, in Federal Court to enjoin the military from preventing their return to the coast.

STOCKADE

ISOLATION AREA EMPTY; OCCUPANTS RETURN HOME

All occupants of the isolation area, commonly called the "stockade," were returned to the colony Saturday, announced the Administration. This marks the first time that the isolation area has been empty since its establishment last November. Conditions in the center at the present time are such that isolation of individuals is no longer considered necessary, it was reported.

A total of 386 men have been occupants of this isolation area since its establishment. Persons originally moved into the area have lived there for periods ranging from one to

ten months.

The Administration said that the cases of these men were reviewed from time to time and when conditions both in the isolation section and the residential area indicated that the presence of these men in the colony would not interfere with the project administration they were accordingly transferred.

Twenty-eight aliens were transferred from the isolation area during the past six months to the Santa Fe Alien Internment Camp in New Mexico, which is under the jurisdiction of the Department of Justice, it was stated.

BEST DEPARTS ON 12-DAY TRIP

Ray Best, project director, departed Sunday morning for a 12-day visit to Minidoka and Topaz centers, reported the Administration. He will confer with various project officials on matters regarding Tule Lake Center.

APPLICATION FOR LAYETTE GRANTS TAKEN AT WELFARE

In regard to inquiries concerning grants for layettes, the conditions governing public assistance grants for these items were answered today by the Welfare Section. A family expecting childbirth and unable to secure the necessary articles for layette may apply in the Welfare District Office for assistance in securing the layette.

The section declared that assistance for a layette may be given only after completion of the seventh month of pregnancy

and then only to obtain the articles necessary for a layette which the family cannot secure otherwise. It was explained that no one can receive financial assistance merely because a child is born, but only in case the family is unable to secure the essential items of the layettes without assistance from some outside source.

The maximum amount of assistance in any case may not exceed \$10.96, it was stated. This amount is the total average cost of purchase

NEARLY THROUGH

Repairing of roofs in the colony is progressing smoothly, states W. J. Lauritzen, assistant construction and maintenance supervisor.

Lauritzen said that work on the barracks is expected to be completed in three weeks. The utility buildings, including mess halls, shower rooms, and ironing rooms, will be taken care of after the completion of the barracks.

HOLDS INITIAL MEETING SINCE RE-ORGANIZATION

The initial Co-op General Assembly since the re-organization of the Executive Body and Board of Directors was held Monday evening in Mess 17 with over 100 Co-op representatives present, announced K. Takizawa, head of Co-op publications.

The assembly opened with the new executive officers expressing greetings and hopes for the efficient management of the center cooperatives. An address was then given by H. Sakuma, chairman of the Board of Directors, and also chairman for the evening.

Main subjects discussed were motion pictures, photo studio, and age-tofu. The plan to have the Co-op operate motion pictures was voted down 54-7. It was also proposed to sell the two standard motion picture projectors which it owns. Forty-nine blocks agreed on having the photo studio (subject to certain conditions) and three voted no. Forty-four blocks assented to age-tofu production on condition that it be sold to the WRA and then distributed to the mess halls. Production will begin as soon as WRA officials accept the pro-

THREE JAILED FOR ASSAULTS

Noboru Harry Hashimoto, 23, 7501-C, and 'Tiger' Terao, 23, 7712-H, were arrested Saturday night by members of the Colonial Peace Department and taken before the project director for a preliminary hearing on assault charges, according to a report by Alan Campbell, project attorney.

On Monday, Jack Maki-hara, 26, 3805-A, was arrested on similar charges. Arrests are expected to continue until the peace of the community is completely assured.

Terao and Hashimoto are being held in the County jail in Klamath Falls and Maki-hara in the County jail in Alturas, pending their trial.

TOTAL INCREASE OF 950 WORKERS SINCE MARCH 31

Figures, according to the Placement Office tabulations, show that 5961 evacuees were on the WRA payroll as of August 15, 1944. This is an increase of 950 workers since March 31, 1944.

The Administrative Management under James H. Wells, assistant project director, employed the most workers with a total of 3189.
