SACRAMENTO -- Plan by the Japanese Exclusion Association to get on the November ballot an initiative measure broadening and putting teeth into the State's alien land law failed because of insufficient signatures to petitions, revealed office of Secretary of State Frank Jordan this

Petitions filed 77,875 signatures--100,000 short of the number required to insure a vote on the measure this year.

The proposed measure was intended to make it economically impossible for persons of Japanese descent to earn a living by prohibiting any Japanese alien from owning or leasing any kind of property in California,


