## FIRE PREVENTION WEEK SUCCESSFUL ADMINISTRATION PRAISES COLONISTS' COOPERATION; REVEALS WARD WINNERS Report \$952.60 Collected In Inonhin Drive

Winners of the center-wide contest for elimination of fire hazards conducted during Fire Prevention Week were announced Tuesday by committee of judges under the chairmanship of Harry Black following a half-day inspection tour of the colony Monday.

First place winners selected by the committee of judges are Ward I, Block 6; Ward II, Block 27; Ward III, Block 23; Ward IV, Block 19; Ward V, Block 48; Ward VI, Block 51; Ward VII, Block 66; Ward VIII, Block 80.

A total of \$952.60 was collected in the Inonhin Fund Drive from the residents, according to Toshio Tomishige, assistant central block manager. The drive to collect five cents per person from every resident to establish a fund pool to defray expenses incurred in the purchase of gifts ended Friday.

A breakdown of the collection revealed the following figures: Ward I, \$109.10; Ward II, \$108.45; Ward III, \$108.55; Ward IV, \$111.20; Ward V, \$112.95; Ward VI, \$126.90; Ward VII, \$110.45; Ward VIII, \$164.85; Hospital, \$.15.

This amount was deposited in the Co-op depository under the joint account of T. Ito, K. Kawacka, and Tomishige, treasurers.

## FAGAN ANNOUNCES WRA EMPLOYMENT POLICY

In order to comply fully with employment regulations issued by Washington, all future employment will be based on the applicant's qualification and not by the applicant's preference, stated Frank Fagan, personnel officer.

When the back-to-work movement started Jan. 15, 1944, it was found necessary to keep a complete register of all evacuees who wanted to return to work. Each evacuee was given an opportunity to indicate his preference as to jobs. Selection was made for jobs based on

qualifications, date of registration, and preference was given whenever it was possible.

The personnel officer said that preference will be given, where possible, to a fully qualified worker. However, if an evacuee desires a particular kind of (cont'd on page 2)

## NEW LATERAL TO BENEFIT 11 BLOCKS

A plan whereby the entire center with the exception of three blocks would be included in the project irrigation system is now being contemplated, it was learned today from Paul Robertson, assistant project director in charge of Operations.

This announcement indicates that water will be provided for approximately

11 blocks in Wards VI and VIII above the 'M' Canal. The operations chief disclosed that after consultations with the engineer staff, a plan to construct a lateral following the contour ridge from the high point in the southwest corner to the new area was decided feasible.

The three blocks (79, 80, 84) 'orphaned' by the

plan need not worry, Robertson said, since they will be allowed the usage of tap water for their watering purposes. This addition to the canal system will naturally decrease the use of tap water by the rest of the colony.

Work on laying of culverts for the laterals is progressing smoothly, he concluded.

## COLONIAL PEACE

### RESIDENTS' COOPERATION LAUDED IN PEACE REPORT

A report today from the Colonial Peace Department disclosed that the relations with the residents has greatly improved since the department's formation two months ago. "The understanding that we have their cooperation and support is encouraging in maintaining peace and order in the community," said the department.

Since its formation Aug. 4, over 200 cases have been handled by the department. A majority of them were lost and found reports. Five persons were convicted and sentenced on assault and threat charges, but this number was reported low in proportion to the population.

The present force is

composed of 131 members and the current 37 vacancies are expected to be filled by November.

Boys who are 18 or older and who have not registered may do so with Mrs. Catherine Johnson, deputy registrar, of the Alturas Board. Her office is in the Administration Building.

The Administration announced that Robert Ross assumed duties as assistant reports officer in the Reports Division this week. He arrived Monday from Boulder, Colo. where he had been instructing at the Boulder Naval Language School for two years.

The new assistant reports officer returned from Japan in 1941 where he had been an instructor of English at Hikone Koto Shogyo in Shiga Prefecture for several years.

## COURT DENIES OCHIKUBO'S SUIT AGAINST MILITARY

LOS ANGELES -- Federal Judge P. L. Hall on Oct. 2 denied the petition of Dr. George Ochikubo of Topaz, Utah, for an injunction to restrain military authorities from preventing his return to his home in Oakland, Calif., according to the Pacific Citizen.

The ruling was handed down after a day of arguments in Federal Court by A. L. Wirin, attorney for Ochikubo, and U. S. Attorney Charles Carr. Carr argued that Ochikubo's case had come up for a hearing before an Army Board and that the military had denied his petition to return to the coast.

The injunction was sought against Maj. Gen. Charles Bonesteel, commanding officer of the Western Defense Command, the Citizen reported.

## GUNDERSON TAKES OVER NEW OFFICE

The vacancy created by Martin Gunderson, former high school principal, who has succeeded Harry Black as acting assistant project director in charge of Community Management, will not be filled until the close of the present semester on Nov. 24, revealed Kenneth Harkness, superintendent of schools. 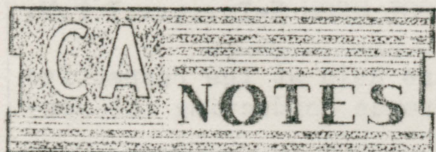

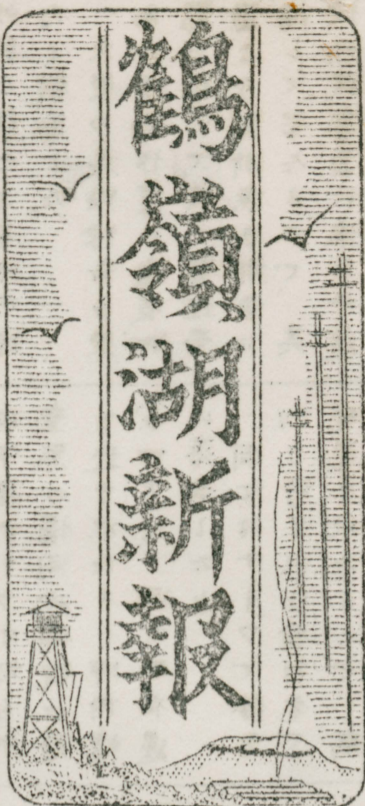
