## MYER ON TULE LAKE

### ASSURES OPERATION OF CENTER THROUGH 1945

In a special statement distributed recently to the residents of Tule Lake Center, Dillon Myer, national WRA director, cleared away misconceptions and unfounded rumors regarding the future of this camp. He assured residents that no forceful ejection of evacuees will be employed in this project, and although plans for a segregation camp beyond Jan. 1, 1946, have not yet been worked out, this center will continue to operate throughout the year.

The text of Myer's statement is as follows:

There may have been some misunderstanding about WRA plans for certain persons in Tule Lake to secure employment and establish homes for themselves out-

side of the center.

Any eligible residents of this center will be given all possible aid in securing employment and in locating in the communities of their choice. However, those who do not wish to leave the center at this time are not required to do so, and may continue to live here or at some similar center until Jan. 1, 1946. This center or some similar center will be maintained for all persons who wish to remain until that time. Plans for a segregation center beyond that time have not yet been finally worked out.

## OFFICE SHIFTS ARE ANNOUNCED

Locations or facilities of several offices in the Administration area have been or are being changed this week, it was announced today.

The Reports Division and the Community Activities Section have moved across the hall into the space which had been occupied by the Welfare Section. The Welfare in turn has moved into the space formerly occupied by the Reports and the Community Activities units.

## BURLING RETURNS TO WASHINGTON

John Burling, special representative of the Department of Justice, who has been conducting hearings on applications for renunciation of citizenship since Jan. 11, returned to Washington last Saturday for an indefinite stay, announced the Administration.

The rest of Burling's staff, however, remained here and the hearings are being continued with Charles Rothstein in charge, it was stated.

## 171 INTERNEES DEPART FOR SANTA FE FRIDAY

The second contingent of 171 internees, segregated from this center last Friday afternoon, reached the Department of Justice alien enemy camp at Santa Fe, N. M., early this week, revealed Ray Best, project director, today. In this group were 27 who were born in Japan and 144 who were citizens of the U. S. by birth but who renounced their citizenship recently before John Burling, Department of Justice representative.

The 171 men who entrained

ed reported voluntarily either to Gate #3 or the Internal Security Headquarters.

## GIBBS TO ASSIST RELOCATION HERE

Preliminary arrangements for setting up a relocation office here were initiated this week with the arrival of Frank Gibbs, Relocation Program officer, from Des Moines, Iowa.

The new office will assist residents in locating and contacting employment or other business opportunities, and in planning their return to former homes and means of livelihood.

Reports prevailing in the colony that the contingent had been split after leaving the center, some of the men going to one camp and some to another, and that 20 or more of the men had been left in Block 99, were declared by the project director to be entirely without foundation. He said, "All 171 men left on the train Friday afternoon, and 171 of them went to Santa Fe."

Last Dec. 27, the first group of 70 internees were removed to Santa Fe.

## ANNOUNCE RESULT OF PEACE OFFICE ELECTION

Chuichiro Ono, chief; Tanzo Toyofuku, assistant chief; and Masaichi Morioka, captain were unanimously re-elected to office Friday at a regular meeting in Mess 19, according to Colonial Peace Headquarters.

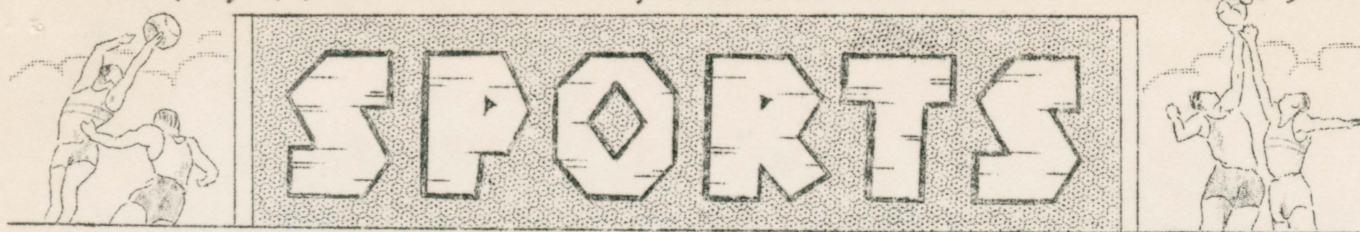

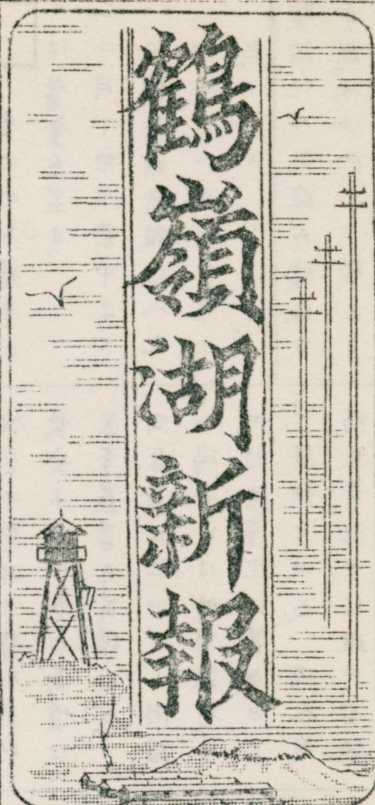

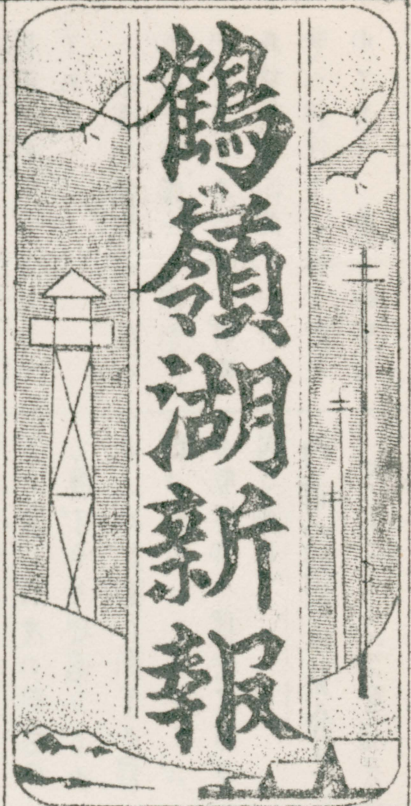
