DEPT. OF JUSTICE

STATUS OF RENUNCIANTS DEFINED BY ROTHSTEIN

Noting that there has been some confusion and misunderstanding resulting from the renunciation hearings, Charles Rothstein, special hearing officer of the Department of Justice, today clarified the status of persons renouncing their citizenship.

The hearing officer explained that the exact status of a person who signs the formal oath of renunciation form upon concluding his hearing is that of an U. S. citizen until such time as the form is approved by the Attorney General as not contrary to the interest of national defense.

With regard to the inquiries whether membership in the organizations existing in the center had any bearing upon renunciation of nationality, the hearing officer advised that applications would be considered upon their individual merit without regard to the fact of whether applicants were or were not members of the organizations.

RUMORS QUELLED

He further advised that there is absolutely no basis for rumors that applicants whose renunciations are disapproved will be drafted into the military service.

Renunciants of U. S. citizenship, he further added, will be notified as to approval or disapproval of their application in due course. This decision

WRA CLOSES QUARTERS OF HOSHI, HOKOKU SEINEN DAN

Acting under authority of a warrant of search, seizure and eviction issued by Ray Best, project director, Internal Security officers Monday night removed the contents of and closed the combined headquarters of Sokuji Kikoku Hoshi Dan and Hokoku Seinen Dan at 5408-A.

Records and other property of the organizations removed from the headquarters have been impounded by the U. S. Government, and the premises have been taken over by the Administration, the project director announced today.

Following is a special statement issued by Mr. Best concerning the action taken by the Administration:

"Seizure of Sokuji Kikoku Hoshi Dan and Hokoku Seinen Dan headquarters was taken following exposure by the Department of Justice of the illegality of these organizations, and of the conduct and activities of the members in open violation of the laws of the U. S.

"Nearly 900 members and officers of these organizations already have been apprehended by the Department of Justice and removed to alien enemy internment camps, where they will be

650 TRANSFEREES REACH BISMARCK, N.D. WEDNESDAY

Project Director Ray Best announced yesterday that 650 men who were transferred Sunday from Tule Lake Center to an alien enemy internment camp under jurisdiction of the Department of Justice had reached Bismarck, N. D.

The contingent which left in the special 21-car train Sunday afternoon was the largest ever to enter or leave Tule Lake in a single movement. The men had luncheon at noon in Block 99. The train departed at 2:30 p.m., as soon as all the men were aboard.

Sunday's transfer brought to 891 the number of men sent from Tule Lake to alien enemy internment camps by the Department of Justice.

It had been alleged that the Tanidas had held the land through subterfuge by deeding it to their five American-born children.

EXCLUDEES NOW ABLE TO RELOCATE EAST AND SOUTH

Excludees now may relocate in the East and the South without restriction, the WRA announced this week.

"Since we have been notified by the War Department that the eastern and southern restrictions have been rescinded," the WRA said in a recent official bulletin, "there no longer seems to be any reason why excludees should not relocate immediately in those areas if they choose."

A previous bulletin advised excludees seeking relocation in eastern and southern zones to defer their plans until official notification was made by the Western Defense Command. Further deferment of plans, it was reported, is not necessary.

REVEAL SHORTAGE OF DENTAL AIDES

Jack Sleath, principal medical officer, asked the residents this week to cooperate with the dental clinic by accepting dental appointments as given and by not seeking immediate service.

Departure last Sunday of four dental assistants, one-third of the entire operating staff, means the loss of nearly 100 appointments a day, he added.

"Immediate steps are being taken to replace these men," the medical officer explained, "but it will be some time before normal operating capacity is reached since it requires six months to train a dental assistant."

MAY CHECK SHOE STAMP ELIGIBILITY

Residents desiring special shoe stamp applications may check their eligibility with the Block Managers Headquarters' files, it was announced at the general meeting of the block managers on Feb. 7. Although the Social Welfare Section handles the applications, it is handicapped by the lack of such records at the present time.

CENTER POLICY

PERMANENT RESIDENCE TO BE DENIED PAROLEES

The WRA disclosed today that persons paroled from internment camps no longer will be inducted as regular residents of centers, in accordance with the post-exclusion policy of WRA on inductions and reinductions. The Immigration and Naturalization Service, administering internment camps, has been advised of the ruling.

Internees who may be paroled in the future, however, will have the privilege of visiting centers for periods of not more than 30 days for relocation planning purposes, provided sponsorship arrangements

are made before leaving internment camps and advance approval (by submission of Form WRA 388) is obtained from the director of the center to be visited. Approval of the nearest field office will not be required and guest charges will not be made when advance approval of the project director has been obtained. The Immigration and Naturalization Service has been furnished a supply of WRA-388 forms for distribution to internment camps, it was stated.

sion will rest upon the applicant's transcribed record and the hearing officer's recommendation. Arrangements for registering approved applicants under the Alien Registration Act will be handled by the Immigration and Naturalization Service.

As to an inquiry whether all persons whose renunciation of citizenship are approved will be sent to internment centers, it was revealed that persons who receive approval of their renunciation, and who behave in an orderly manner will be permitted to remain here until a definite plan for Tule Lake is decided upon by the Department of Justice and the WRA.

CONTACT WITH JAPAN THROUGH RED CROSS

"We received your message and are relieved. We are all well in government camp. Do not worry. Please take care of yourself. Regards to all."

Thus reads a typical concise 25-word Red Cross message (Form 1616) sent by Tuleans to kins in Japan. No mention of geographical names, business, financial or property matters is allowed. The time required for transmission of such communications is uncertain, but similar Red Cross messages from Japan to resi-

dents here have arrived within three months.

Sending and delivering messages is just one of the valuable services afforded residents in Tule Lake by the Red Cross. On busy days approximately 50 messages are sent, and an average of 150 brief communications from Japan are delivered to residents in this center. Every individual is allowed to send four Red Cross messages (Form 1616) per year in either Japanese or English or in both languages.

CA Athletic Dept. announced this week that the Class AA Basketball League composed of four teams will be launched Sunday, Feb. 25, at the high school gymnasium.

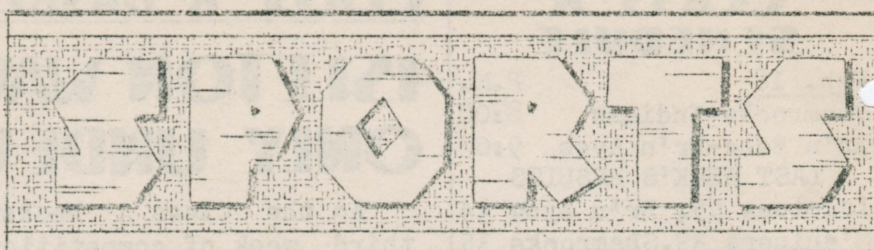
The four squads in the loop include Mustangs, Okole House, Pacers, and Wrex.

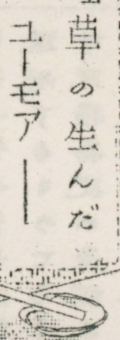

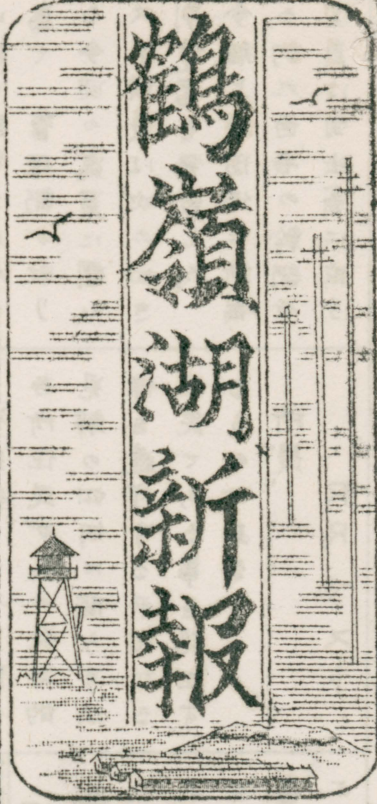
